Monroe County Fiscal Court Request for Proposals for Engineering Services

The Monroe County Fiscal Court is requesting responses to this Request for Proposals (RFP) from qualified firms interested in providing engineering services in connection with the design and costing of (3) FEMA P-361-compliant community tornado safe rooms to be constructed within Monroe County, KY in the cities of Fountain Run (50-person capacity), Gamaliel (50-person capacity), and Tompkinsville (100-person capacity).

The proposed safe rooms will be funded through the FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (CFDA No. 97.039) and must be compliant with all requirements of FEMA publication P-361, Safe Rooms for Tornadoes and Hurricanes: Guidance for Community and Residential Safe Rooms (2021), which can be accessed at the following link:

All work performed must comply with all applicable federal and state requirements and guidelines, including the 2024 FEMA Hazard Mitigation Assistance Program and Policy Guide (FP-206-21-0001). The final design drawings must be stamped by a licensed engineer certifying that they meet the requirements of FEMA P-361. Responses should be mailed or hand-delivered in a sealed envelope no later than November 21, 2024, at 9:00 am CST to the Monroe County Fiscal Court Offices located at:

Any responses received after this deadline will not be considered. Responses shall clearly show the qualifications of the responding firm in paper format. Three (3) copies of the bidder's technical qualifications response should be included in a sealed envelope marked FEMA Safe Room Engineering. The exact format of the technical qualification response is at the discretion of the respondent. Overly complex or lengthy response packages should be avoided. The respondent should include a firm price proposal for how it will be compensated for the requested services.

The Monroe County Fiscal Court will have final decisions in all matters regarding acceptance of proposals and issuance of awards. The Monroe County Fiscal Court reserves the right to reject any or all responses and to solicit responses again later. The Monroe County Fiscal Court may waive any irregularities in the proposals, negotiate variances from the designated specifications, and may make awards that are, in its discretion, in the best interests of the Monroe County Fiscal Court and Monroe County, KY.
