

Public Notice is hereby given that Mrs. Beverly Smith at 4798 Hwy 15 South, Jackson, Kentucky 41339, has filed an application with the Energy & Environment Cabinet to place fill material along and adjacent to the North Fork of the Kentucky River. This application addresses the placement of 23,000 cubic yards of fill material on the edge of the flood plain. The fill area will be 1.35 acres and will raise the lot to an elevation of 752 ft. The property is located 5.2 miles south of the intersection of Washington Avenue and Kentucky Highway 15, adjacent to the North Fork of the Kentucky River. In accordance with KRS 350.070, notice is hereby given that Knott County Coal LLC, 11000 Highway 7 South, Kite, KY, 41828 has applied for a major revision of a permit for a loadout facility affecting 163.0 acres surface and 0.0 acres of underground area. The operation is located approximately 0.1 miles west of Kragon in Breathitt County, Kentucky. This major revision will not add any surface disturbance or underground acreage to the permit.

The proposed major revision is approximately 2.6 miles south from KY 1111 and located 0.05 miles west of North Fork of the Kentucky River.

The proposed major revision is located on the Quicksand U.S.G.S. 7 1/2 minute quadrangle map. The surface to be affected by this major revision is owned by Doug Terry. This application contains a request for a variance for experimental practice from the requirement to 405 KAR 16:190 as required under regulation 405 KAR 7:060.

The major revision proposes a change in the post mining land use from approved pastureland use to residential land use and experimental practice to leave highwall.

The application has been filed for public inspection at the Division of Mine Reclamation and Enforcement's Hazard Regional Office, 556 Village Lane, P. O. Box 851, Hazard, Kentucky 41702. Written comments, objections, or requests for a permit conference must be filed with the Director, Division of Mine Permits, 300 Sower Blvd., Frankfort, Kentucky 40601.

AEP Foundation grants \$36K to technical colleges, provides lineworker program scholarships

The American Electric Power (AEP) Foundation recently announced \$36,000 in grant awards that support equitable educational opportunities for students interested in enrolling in the lineworker certificate program at one of three Kentucky Technical and Community College System schools. The grants were recommended by Kentucky Power, reinforcing a commitment to fostering diversity and inclusion in those programs.

Ashland, Big Sandy and Hazard community and technical colleges will each receive \$12,000 grants specifically designated for line school scholarships in effort to encourage participation in the electrical industry. The grants provide a total of 18 scholarships, available over the next three years, to support the costs of tuition, books, fees and tools needed to participate in the lineworker certification program.

Kentucky Power has partnered with each college in the past through previously awarded scholarship opportunities, training assistance and equipment donations to support student learning.

"We believe it's important to support the next generation of line workers and students interested in our industry," said Amy Elliott, Kentucky Power's vice president of external affairs and customer service. "Because utilities across the country are competing for line crew employees, our goal is to see these scholarships help boost our workforce by providing an opportunity for students to find a job close to their homes here in eastern Kentucky."
