Questions may be directed to Tim Spencer, Superintendent, at Central Office. Those individuals who would like to comment on the proposed District Facility Plan may present oral or written comments at the local board public hearing. The local Board of Education, after due process, will forward the approved District Facility Plan to the Kentucky Department of Education for ultimate approval by the State of Education. The local board public hearing is being scheduled in accordance with KRS 157.620, and regulated by 702 KAR 4:180.
