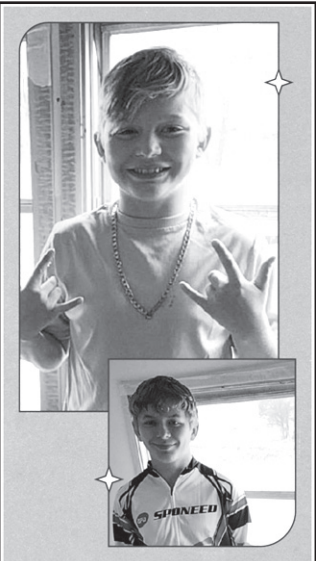


# OBITUARIES

The rates contained in this notice are the rates proposed by Bath County Water District. However, the Public Service Commission may order rates to be charged that differ from these proposed rates. Such action may result in rates for consumers other than the rates shown in this notice.

The District has requested that the Public Service Commission allow the proposed rates to go into effect for water service rendered on and after July 15, 2025. However, the Public Service Commission may determine that additional time is necessary to review the reasonableness of the rates. In that instance, the District has requested that the Public Service Commission authorize interim rates to become effective July 15, 2025, that are necessary for the District to pass through an increase to purchase water costs paid to the Morehead Utility Plant Board. The interim rates would remain in effect until the Public Service Commission rules on the District's final rates.

Bath County Water District has available for inspection at its office the application which it submitted to the Public Service Commission. A person may examine this application at the District's office located at 21 Church Street, Salt Lick, Kentucky 40371. You may contact the office at 606-683-6363.

A person may also examine the application at the Public Service Commission's offices located at 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, Kentucky, 40601, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., or through the Public Service Commission's website at <http://psc.ky.gov>. Comments regarding the application may be submitted to the Public Service Commission through its website or by mail to Public Service Commission, PO Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky, 40602. You may contact the Public Service Commission at 502-564-3940.

A person may submit a timely written request for intervention to the Public Service Commission, PO Box 615, Frankfort, KY, 40602, establishing the grounds for the request including the status and interest of the party. If the Public Service Commission does not receive a written request for intervention within thirty (30) days of the initial publication of this notice, the Public Service Commission may take final action on the application.
