The District has requested that the Public Service Commission allow the proposed rates to go into effect for water service rendered on and after July 15, 2025. However, the Public Service Commission may determine that additional time is necessary to review the reasonableness of the rates. In that instance, the District has requested that the Public Service authorize interim rates to become effective July 15, 2025, that are necessary for the District to pass through an increase to purchase water costs paid to the Morehead Utility Plant Board. The interim rates would remain in effect until the Public Service Commission rules on the

Bath County Water District has available for inspection at its office the application which it submitted to the Public Service Commission. A person may submit a timely written request for intervention to the Public Service Commission, PO Box 615, Frankfort, KY, 40602, establishing the grounds for the request including the status and interest of the party. If the Public Service Commission does not receive a written request for intervention within thirty (30) days of the initial publication of this notice, the Public Service Commission may take final action on the application.
