Free Hunter Education course in Frenchburg

A free Kentucky Hunter Education course is scheduled for Saturday, August 23, 2025 at the Frenchburg Community Center in the Clark Energy Building on Bible Camp Rd. next to Frenchburg IGA (now called The Market) in Frenchburg. The course will start at 9am and end at 5:00 pm. You must attend all day. The course, sponsored by the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources and the Menifee Fish and Game Club, includes classroom instruction in hunter ethics, wildlife identification, outdoor survival, first aid, firearm safety, bow hunting and ammunition. At the end of the day, students will complete a written exam and live fire at the Menifee County Fish and Game Club Range. Firearms and ammunition will be provided. We will have a lunch break around noon and there are a few places nearby to purchase sandwiches. Class size is limited to 25. A course completion card will be issued to successful students which is valid in any state, province or territory in North America.

Pre-registration is required for all courses and is completed by visiting the Hunter Education page at fw.ky.gov. Class size is limited.

Persons born on or after January 1, 1975, shall carry a valid hunter education course completion card while hunting. Kentucky accepts certifications from other states. A bow hunter not in possession of a firearm may carry a hunter education or a bow hunter education course completion card from any state. Hunter Education certification is in addition to appropriate license and permit requirements. Children must be 9 years old in order to complete the course. Children under age 12 and persons exempt from purchasing a hunting license are not required to possess a hunter education card while hunting. However, children under age 12 who have not completed hunter education shall be accompanied by an adult of at least 18 years of age while hunting.

INSPECTION PERIOD

FOR THE PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENT ROLL

The Menifee County real estate property tax roll will be opened for inspection from 7/31/25 thru 8/14/25. Under the supervision of the Property Valuation Administrator or one of the deputies, any person may inspect the tax roll. This is the January 1, 2025 assessment on which state, country and school taxes for 2025 will be due about November 1.

The tax roll is in the office of the Property Valuation Administrator's office and may be inspected between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

Any taxpayer desiring to appeal an assessment on real property made by the PVA must first request a conference with the PVA or a designated deputy. The conference may be held prior to or during the inspection period. Any taxpayer still aggrieved by an assessment on real property, after the conference with the PVA or designated deputy, may appeal to the county board of assessment appeals.

The taxpayer can appeal his assessment by filing in person or sending a letter or other written petition stating reasons for appeal, identifying the property and stating the taxpayer's opinion of the fair cash value of the property.

The appeal must be filed with the county cler's office no later than one weekday following the conclusion of the inspection period.

Any taxpayer failing to appeal to the county board of assessment appeals or failing to appear before the board, either in person or by designated representative, will not be eligible to appeal directly to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.

Appeals of personal property assessments shall not be made to the county board of assessment appeals. Personal property taxpayers shall be served notice under the provisions of KRS 132.450(4) and shall have the protest and appeal rights granted under the provisions of KRS 131.110.

The following steps should be taken when a taxpayer does not agree with the assessed value of personal property as determined by the PVA.

- (1) The taxpayer must list under protest what he believes is the fair cash value.
- (2) The taxpayer must file a written protest directly with the Department of Revenue, within 30 days from the date of the notice of assessment.
- (3) This protest must be in accordance with KRS 131.110.
- (4) The final decision of the Department of Revenue may be appealed to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.
