Way Back When: The Old Days

Way back in the 1950s in Elliott County, life in the country was laid back. I mean, laid

We had no communication from the outside world – no telephone, cell phone, internet, Spotify, nothing like that.

All we had was a black and white television, that got three channels in good weather. We got up to change the channels

using a knob on the TV. We did have an old radio that Daddy kept in the bedroom to listen to the Grand Ole Opry every Saturday night. That

was it. Not having these amenities would cause a panic attack in

kids today. Daddy was a farmer and relied heavily on the 6 o'clock TV news and weather report. We had to relay what the weather man said when daddy got home.

If I failed to watch it, I'd be in trouble when he asked and I didn't know. So I'd make up my own forecast and tell him to keep from getting in trouble. It worked most of the time. Even good weather men, with all their instruments, get it wrong

Our house was so hot in the summer and cold in the winter. It was like a 100 degrees sometimes at night, and the snow blew in through a crack underneath the front door in the winter. We had no central air conditioning, heat pump or furnace back then.

We heated with coal in the winter, and Mommy cooked and canned on the wood stove – even in the summer, until Daddy bought her an electric

stove in 1966.

I remember the left rear burner had a deep well built in. It was kind of like a built in stock pot with a lid. You fit the kettle on the burner, twisted, and the burner turned and dropped down inside the stove with the pot. It worked great.

I remember it was 1966 because Mommy and baby sister Joy finally had their turn to go to Florida with Grandpa and Grandma. While they were gone for the week, Daddy and us kids did a remodeling job at home.

Daddy and the kids tried to carry out the big old stove, but it was way too heavy for us. He took a sledge hammer and beat our darling old home comfort wood cookstove to pieces. Us kids carried them out and threw them in a gully hole in the pasture field.

Our bedroom was off the back of the kitchen. In the winter with no heat from that stove anymore, our bedroom was so much colder. We relied heavily on lots of extra quilts on cold nights. We pulled them over our heads with a little breathing tunnel.

We had no phone at our house. All messages were written in a letter and sent through

the mail. We lived a very sheltered life back then. Our parents never set us down and told us anything. It was not a thing back then. I didn't even know where babies come from until I was 10 years old when a girl at my school told me. She knew, because she had several married sisters with children.

I thought babies came from the hospital, cause parents
