Samuel and Abby are going to the revival service tonight. I had a late afternoon visit from Nephew Michael Peters; he is preparing to move a trailer onto his land by the old garage his Dad had years and years ago. His wife Janet Weaver Peters passed recently and he is mourning the burial of her - his third wife to pass away after he cared for them. I was late to revival service but Stephanie and I arrived at Fannin EBC about the same time; service had started; we got seated, group singing started, and Samuel and Abby arrived. We moved Bibles, purses, and tissue boxes to make room on the pew; a large crowd participated in this Saturday evening service; I give Jesus Praise and Thanks for blessings, freedom to worship in spirit and in truth.

June 8 – We make plans in our mind and Jesus laughs (I think). I planned to take the cake to Fannin EBC for the meal after church but go to Laurel Gorge EBC to worship with Samuel and Abby.
