The Irvington City Council received the proposed city budget for the coming fiscal year on Monday.

At Monday evening's regular city council meeting, the budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1 was reviewed. The General Fund Budget is \$911,476, and the Water/Sewer Budget is \$1,010,491.


