SBA disaster relief still available; deadline for physical damage loans approaching

ness Administration (SBA) is reminding elinizations, homeowners, and renters in Kentucky of the June 23 deadline to apply for low-interest federal disaster loans. These loans are designed to offset losses from physical damage caused by the severe storms, straightline winds, flooding, landslides, and mudslides that began on April 2. The disaster declaration covers the primary counties of Anderson, Breckinridge, Bullitt, Butler, Calloway, Carroll, Christian, Clark, Daviess, Franklin, Garrard, Grayson, Hancock, Hardin, Hart, Henderson, Henry, Hopkins, Jefferson, Jessamine, LaRue, Lincoln, McCracken, McLean, Meade, Mercer, Muhlenberg, Nelson, Ohio, Oldham, Owen, Pendleton, Powell, Trimble, Warren, Webster, and Woodford. These counties are eligible for both physical damage loans and Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) from the SBA. Small businesses and most private nonprofit (PNP) organizations in the following adjacent counties are eligible to apply only for SBA EIDLs: Allen, Ballard, Barren, Bourbon, Boyle, Caldwell, Campbell, Carlisle, Casey, Crittenden, Edmonson, Estill, Fayette, Gallatin, Grant, Graves, Green, Harrison, Kenton, Lee, Livingston, Logan, Madison, Marion, Marshall, Menifee, Metcalfe, Montgomery, Pulaski, Rockcastle, Scott, Shelby, Simpson, Spencer, Taylor, Todd, Trigg, Union, Washington, and Wolfe in Kentucky; Massac and Pulaski in Illinois; Clark, Crawford, Floyd, Harrison, Jefferson, Perry, Posey, Spencer, Switzerland, Vanderburgh, and


