ORDINANCE NO. 2025-04

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HARDINSBURG, KENTUCKY AMENDING THE EXISTING WATER AND SEWER SERVICE CONNECTIONS & FEES

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Hardinsburg, Kentucky recognizes there exists a need to implement a policy regarding when water usage bills begin upon installation of a water meter, and

WHEREAS the City Council recognizes that due to a lack of communication from the customer, the start of water usage after a meter is installed is often not reported to the City of Hardinsburg.

NOW THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Hardinsburg, Kentucky does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION I – amendment to present 2022-01, 2012-03 relating to water connection charges; ordinance 2005-06, ordinances 94-12-1, ordinance 620.22 and 610.92. That amended ordinance regulating the connection and service charges adopted by the City Council of the City of Hardinsburg is amended as to Section 52.106 (add Section C) in the Code of Ordinances to read as follows:

(A) A water connection charge shall be made for each water connection within the city limits of the City of Hardinsburg in the amount of \$1,150.00 and all connection charges outside of the City of Hardinsburg shall be \$1,250.00.

(B) A sewer connection charge shall be made for each sewer connection within the sewer system in the amount of \$500.00.

(C) At the time of the installation of the water meter, the customer shall be responsible for the minimum monthly water usage bill, or for the amount of actual usage, whichever is higher.

SECTION II - SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any clause, provision, or section of this Ordinance shall be ruled void or unenforceable heretofore adopted prescribing water and sewer rates and charges in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and this Ordinance shall become effective July 1, 2025, upon its enactment, approval, and publication as provided by law.

Introduced, publicly read, and approved upon its first reading on the **10th day of June 2025**.

Publicly read, passed, and finally approved upon its second reading on the **11th day of June 2025**.

MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 2025-03

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PRESENT ORDINANCES SETTING WATER RATE CHARGES FOR THE CITY OF HARDINSBURG, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Hardinsburg, Kentucky, recognizes the need to change the existing water rate charges for the City of Hardinsburg to generate sufficient revenues to meet all its expenses related to water; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has maintained a policy that all services provided to its customers should generate sufficient revenues for said services, to cover all costs and expenses; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Hardinsburg, Kentucky, does hereby ordain.

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT OF \$52.105 SCHEDULE OF RATES AND CHARGES FOR WATER (A)(2) and (B) and (C) IN THE CITY OF HARDINSBURG CODE OF ORDINANCES; ORDINANCES 610.91, 610.92, 620-22, 620.25, 620-26, 97-3.1, 97-9.4, 98-7.3, 2000-11.1, 2002-2, 2003-06, 2004-03, 2005-05, 2005-09, 2011-01, 2014-01, 2020-05, 2021-02, 2022-11, and 2023-07.

WATER RATE CHARGES:

WHEREAS the City of Hardinsburg is eliminating the five different groups of water customers and simplifying the rates as defined below.

In Town Rate = Water customers that live **inside** city limits and are tax paying citizens of the city of Hardinsburg.

Out of Town Rate = Water customers that live **outside** city limits and are non-tax paying citizens of the city of Hardinsburg.

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SECTION 2: CONSUMER PRICE INDEX ADJUSTMENT OF RATES

Effective July 1, 2024, and each July thereafter, the rates and charges for the usage of water by all customers of the Hardinsburg Municipal Utilities (HMU) shall be increased by the same percentage as the increase in the US Department of Labor Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the preceding calendar year, if, in fact the CPI has increased in the preceding calendar year. The City Clerk and Treasurer of the City shall calculate and implement an increase for the usage of water for all HMU customers by applying the percentage of increase for the CPI for the preceding calendar year to each current HMU water rate and charge. Notice of the CPI percentage increase of each water rate and charge shall be mailed to each HMU customer not later than May 30. The increase in rate charges shall take effect in July monthly water bill and shall remain in effect for a 12-month period until the new CPI increase in the water rate charges takes effect. If the CPI has not increased in the preceding calendar year, then no increase in water rate charges to HMU customers shall occur for that fiscal year.

SECTION 3: Meter Profiling Fee

Effective January 1, 2024, The City of Hardinsburg will impose a Meter Profiling Fee of 25.00 per profile. If the customer requests a meter to be profiled for a billing dispute, and the water meter has the capability to do so, the fee will be added to the next billing cycle. If the profile shows a billing error due to equipment malfunction, the fee will be waived and there will be no added cost to the customer.

SECTION 4: System Development Charges

Effective August 1, 2024, The City of Hardinsburg will impose a System Development Charge (SDS). The customer is advised that the City Council has formally supported the use of System Development Charges (SDC's) as a method to recover capital costs for system expansion from new and existing customers increasing their service demand or size. Customers are advised that a 1.00 SDS fee will be applied to each account starting with the August 1, 2024, billing cycle.


SECTION 5. REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES

All City Ordinances, Orders Resolutions, Motions, and parts thereof; insofar as the same may be in conflict herewith, are repealed and this Ordinance shall take effect, from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law and will be effective on the **July 2025** monthly billing.

ORDINANCE 2025-01**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2024-010, THE CITY OF HARDINSBURG, KENTUCKY'S ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2024, THROUGH JUNE 30, 2025, BY ESTIMATING REVENUES AND RESOURCES AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF CITY GOVERNMENT

WHEREAS an annual budget proposal and message has been prepared and delivered to the legislative body and,

WHEREAS the legislative body has reviewed such budget proposal and made necessary modifications.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF HARDINSBURG

SECTION I That the annual budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, is adopted as follows:

SECTION II This budget ordinance shall be administered by the executive authority as prescribed and set forth in the Kentucky Revised Statutes. Administration shall include but not be limited to at least the following:

A. Preparation and submission of financial statements, which include budgetary comparisons on not less than a quarterly basis.

B. Provide for budget amendments if called for by the Council or anticipated through implementation.

C. Prepare any financial statements required for publication purposes pursuant to KRS 424 and 91A.

D. Cause each fund of this budget to be audited as prescribed by law.

SECTION III This ordinance shall be published in the Breckinridge Herald-News newspaper by title and summary within thirty (30) days after adoption.

SECTION IV This ordinance becomes effective immediately upon passage and publication as required by law.
