

North Oldham (6-1, 2-0), 52-14. Breckinridge County committed four turnovers in the loss to the Mustangs, and still managed to finish with 268 yards

"We knew that we had a great team in North Oldham coming in, but our kids have begun to evolve their mentality to where they are willing to fight anybody each week to compete," Hottell said. "We don't just roll over for anybody, and that was evident Thursday night. There are generally two ways that games when you have a great team coming in can go. You can shy away from the opportunity and get rolled quickly, or you can choose to fight and compete.

"If you get beat, you want the other team to have to work to get it and play four quarters to do it, and, for the second week in a row, we made a really good team play four quarters against us to finish us off; something they did not want to do," he added.

Junior quarterback Jacob Spitzer passed for one touchdown and threw for 63 yards and also rushed for a score and 68 yards on 20 carries for the Tigers. He also had a two-point conversion.

His TD pass went to junior Paxton Dewitt, who had two catches for 50 yards.

The Tigers gave up 442 yards to the Mustangs.

"We knew we were going to struggle to contain their potent offense, so we needed to control the clock to give ourselves a shot," Hottell said.

Dewitt had a team-high seven tackles for a defense that was unable to turn North Oldham over.

Senior Hudson Wrenn added five tackles. The Tigers return to action Oct. 17 against Doss (0-6,0-1) and then close district play the next week against Waggener (1-5,0-1). Waggener and Doss play this week, which will give the Tigers a clear picture of what they need to accomplish to get in the playoffs.

"Overall, we are very happy with where we are as a program and a team right now," he said. "We thought we gave one away in the opener, but we have bounced back to pick up two wins and have competed each week really well," Hottell said.

The top four teams in the district reach the playoffs.
