Request for Qualifications for Engineering/Professional Consultants Services

The Kentucky River Area Development District is soliciting qualifications from qualified professional consultants to facilitate the creation of Community Wildfire Protection Plans for our eight counties solicited as one proposal.

The consultant will be responsible for complete creation of the Kentucky River Area Development District’s (KRADD) Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPPs) for our eight-county region.
