Squirrel hunting is ideal for novice hunters because it is not as equipment-intensive as many kinds of hunting. It also helps hunters develop their woodsmanship skills. Weather isn't a huge deterrent for squirrels, although they tend to hide on windy

days. "On sunny days, they like to lay prone on branches to absorb the warmth sunlight," Rhoden added. Many hunters use shotguns during the spring season because of the leaves on the
