You should also factor in expected year-to-year increases in tuition, room, board and other fees. This analysis can help you narrow down schools within financial reach for your family. Consider appealing: While an award package can seem like it's set in stone, you may be able to appeal for more aid from the school of your choice. Don't be afraid to ask for more aid if your financial situation has changed. Look for outside assistance: Scholarships are typically based on merit or talents and can provide substantial assistance. Colleges and univer-
