In hopes of receiving funding for multiple projects,

McCreary County Fiscal Court met in a special-called meeting on Monday (8-25) at 11:00 a.m. to approve various grant applications and items.

First, the Court unanimously approved a resolution allowing McCreary County Fiscal Court to enter into and file an application

with the KY Department of Local Government for Community Projects, requesting \$850,000 for the construction of a new fire station for
