Book Review: 'April 1861' captures drama that occurred before Civil War's first shots

More than two decades have passed since historian Jay Winik wrote about the end of the Civil War with a book with “April 1865: The Month That Saved America.” His latest book covers the period of time that nearly led to its dis-

integration.

In “1861: The Lost Peace,” Winik covers the lead-up to the first shots being fired at Fort Sumter. The political intrigue leading up to 1861 rivals the battlefield action readers come to expect from many Civil War histories.

The overarching story is a familiar but important one for students of

history: how a lowly Illinois congressman rose to power to lead a nation through its great divide over slavery and saved the American Experiment.

Winik chronicles Abraham Lincoln’s evolution as a politician and as someone who “was careful never to step too far ahead of prevailing opinion.”

INSPECTION PERIOD
FOR THE PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENT ROLL

The Shelby County real property tax roll will be opened for inspection from **May 27, 2025 through June 10, 2025**. Under the supervision of the Property Valuation Administrator (PVA) or one of the deputies, any person may inspect the tax roll.

This is the January 1, 2025 assessment on which state, county and school taxes for 2025 will be due about September 15, 2025.

The tax roll is in the office of the Property Valuation Administrator in the county courthouse annex and may be inspected between the hours of **8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon Saturday**.

Any taxpayer desiring to appeal an assessment on real property made by the PVA must first request a conference with the PVA or a designated deputy. The conference may be held prior to or during the inspection period. **Taxpayer conferences with the PV A may be held remotely or in person. Remote conferences may be held via email (Brad.McDowell@ky.gov), phone (502-633-4403), or fax (502-633-4408).** Documentation supporting your opinion of value will continue to be required; however, you will receive specific instructions on the best method to submit your documentation after contacting our office about your intention to have a conference.

Any taxpayer still aggrieved by an assessment on real property, after the conference with the PVA or designated deputy, may appeal to the county board of assessment appeals.

The taxpayer can appeal his assessment by filing in person or sending a letter or other written petition stating the reasons for appeal, identifying the property and stating the taxpayer’s opinion of the fair cash value of the property.

The appeal must be filed with the county clerk’s office no later than one work day following the conclusion of the inspection period.

Any taxpayer failing to appeal to the county board of assessment appeals, or failing to appear before the board, either in person or by designated representative, will not be eligible to appeal directly to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.

Appeals of personal property assessments shall not be made to the county board of assessment appeals. Personal property taxpayers shall be served notice under the provisions of KRS 132.450(4) and shall have the protest and appeals rights granted under the provisions of KRS 131.110.


The following steps should be taken when a taxpayer does not agree with the assessed value of personal property as determined by the office of property valuation administrator:

- (1) He must list under protest (for certification) what he believes to be the fair cash value of his property.
- (2) He must file a written protest directly with the Depaiiment of Property Valuation within 30 days from the date of the notice of assessment.
- (3) This protest must be in accordance with KRS 131.110.
- (4) The final decision of the Revenue Cabinet may be appealed to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.
