

GLICOD to live stream high school events

GLICOD, the Lexington, KY-based company that has provided live coverage of High School Sports throughout parts of Kentucky and Indiana for over a decade, adds the Shelby County Rockets and Collins Titans to its roster for the 2025-26 season.

The action starts Friday, August 22nd with a 6 pm ET football matchup in

Lexington, as Collins travels to Lafayette.

GLICOD will also feature the Titans and Rockets in their cross-county football rivalry game on Friday, September 5th.

Collins leads Shelby Co. in that series 11-7, and has won 4 of their last 5 matchups, including a 35-0 shutout win last year.

the Rockets and Titans will also be presented on GLICOD Tuesday, August 26th (boys) and Wednesday, September 10th (girls).

where we weren't as organized as we should be and Ruby can fix a lot of that communication on the backline and, as a freshman, that's huge. She's starting to feel confident to be able to lead older players.

"We have a lot of club players, whether they play local or in the Louisville area and that talent is starting to feed into us," he added. "Obviously there's been some work done at our local parks and our middle schools to see that talent and follow up with them. I go to a lot of those club games just to follow up on them and see their progress. There's a lot of talent and we keep pulling them into our program young so they get that experience and get used to our coaching staff so they can build that confidence up and perform at a high level."

However, just because an influx of talented freshmen and sophomores and a group of middle schoolers behind them have Sanchez excited for what the Rockets can be two or more years down the road, doesn't mean that there's not plenty of upperclassmen leadership on this year's installment of Shelby County.

Players like Olivia Lumbatis, who had three goals and an assist for Shelby last year, but will be filling the shoes of last year's leading scorer Cassie Dale who graduated.

"Olivia definitely is a strong player and she's probably our

fastest player coming back after we lost Cassie," Sanchez explained. "The hardest thing for her is getting that confidence to be able to put the ball in the net. She creates a lot of opportunities for us and gives us depth, we're just missing that final token of getting the ball in the net."

Sanchez is also looking at players like Amaya Moore and Madeline Breitenstein to be leaders in the midfield for a young Rockets core.

Sanchez knows that what he lost most in the five seniors who departed is their experience as almost all of them have been in the Shelby soccer program since middle school. But what he has coming in for 2025 is a plethora of exciting talent and he can already see the impact that's having on the pitch and in the stands.

"It's exciting to be able to see fans excited to watch something like great passing. It's unheard of for a girls' team to have the fans filling up every year. At our soccerama, we had a bigger crowd than our boys varsity team," he said "That comes from the talent. It comes from the girls who are playing. Their parents want to see them score goals and have a great time. It's definitely changing the soccer scene and that comes from the club level and the expectations that they have."

And with all of that talent and varying amounts of experience, Sanchez is eyeing a trip to the district championship game, which will put the Rockets in the Regional Tournament.

successors of what Lingo brought to the team, be that from one player or as a group. What he hopes that group takes away from last year's captain is his determination to win.

"The one thing that comes to my mind is at the end of last year, in our last huddle after the regional championship game, Jack talked about how he doesn't care that people see him different. He said he's not different, he just doesn't like to lose. It doesn't matter if it's a passing drill, a race or a game, he said he just does anything in his power to make sure he wins," he said.

"I hope a lot of that carries over to this group more than anything. Jack was special, but Jack's gone and he's not coming back. My hope would be that somebody else or a group can step into those shoes seamlessly."

That senior class includes talent all over the field with Eli Scott and Brody Harris being the team's leading returning scorers with 12 and 10 goals, respectively, Lincoln Laubach who had six goals and three assists a year ago and Gage Miller who will man the net for the Titans.

"Those kids have been around the program and understand what our expectations are as coaches and what the standard is for the program because they've been a part of


building up to what we are," Johnson said. "I think this group is more than capable of maybe collectively taking that torch of leadership and carrying it along."

But it isn't just the short-term success Johnson is excited about. He's got a trio of freshmen who will be getting significant minutes on the varsity squad and Renato Carrasco as a returning sophomore who was thrust into a starting role in last year's postseason run that came up a goal short of the state tournament.

All-in-all, Johnson looks at the team he's got coming back to him in 2025 and is excited about it, not only because of the individual players he has on the pitch, but because of the culture he and they have built

together at Collins and so, for him and the Titans, a successful season is the same as it's ever been.

"Obviously, another deep run into the regional tournament. We've set the standard that that's what we're looking for each year. We have a lot to do before we get to that point, but we've set the standard and that's what it is. We make a run in the regional tournament and whatever happens happens."

Z-491-25 & S-2028-25: An application for a Zone Change and Preliminary Planned Unit Development Plan by Blue Steel Development (Applicant) and TDA Properties, Inc. (Owner) for property located at 93 & 179 Logan Station Road & 2539, 2933 & 3015 Taylorsville Road, Shelbyville, KY from Agricultural (A) to Light Industrial (I-1). The Preliminary Planned Unit Development (PUD) proposes a large-scale industrial complex with three (3) lots on 199.96 acres. No development plans are proposed for Lots 1 and 2, but Lot 3 proposes three (3) buildings with 1,804,450 square feet of building area, 556 parking spaces and 972 tractor trailer parking spaces.

The applicant is requesting a 5.34 feet front yard setback variance and a 14.45 feet side yard setback variance to allow an existing structure to be 94.66 feet and 10.55 feet from the front and side property lines instead of the required 100 feet and 25 feet setback requirements.
