Shelby jobless rate among state's best

FRANKFORT Unemployment rates fell in 73 counties, rose in 35 counties and stayed the same in 12 counties between July 2024 and July 2025, according to the Kentucky Center for Statistics (KYSTATS), an agency within the Kentucky Education and Labor Cabinet.

Shelby County was one of those who dropped in the past year and its current rate is one of the lowest in the state.

unemployment rate was 4.8 percent. This was higher than the previous month where 4.0 percent of Shelby County work force members were reported unemployed.

In July 2024, Shelby County's unemployment rate was 5.2 percent.

County Woodford recorded the lowest jobless

at 4.5 percent.

It was followed by Fayette, Oldham and Scott counties, 4.7 percent each; and Boone, Campbell, Cumberland, Harrison, Kenton and Shelby counties, 4.8 percent each.

In the Bluegrass Area Development District, Woodford County was the lowest at 4.5 percent, followed by Fayette and Scott counties at 4.7 percent. Harrison County was next at 4.8 percent, followed by Jessamine County and Boyle

County each at 4.9 percent. Garrard County checked For July 2025, the local in 5 percent, along with Anderson County.

Martin County recorded the state's highest unemployment rate at 10.8 percent. It was followed by Wolfe County, 9.8 percent; Lewis County, 9.7 percent; Magoffin County, 9.6 percent; Elliott County, 8.9 For the past month, the percent; Pike County, 8.8 Shelby County work force percent; Carter and Jackson counties, 8.6 percent each; reporting to be without a Harlan County, 8.4 percent; and Knott County, 8.3 percent.

Kentucky's

rate in the commonwealth unemployment rates and employment levels are not seasonally adjusted because of small sample sizes. Employment statistics undergo sharp fluctuations due to seasonal events such as weather changes, harvests, holidays, and school openings and closings. Seasonal adjustments eliminate these influences and make it easier to observe statistical trends. The comparable, unadjusted unemployment rate for the state was 5.6 percentfor July 2025, and 4.6 percent for the nation.

> Unemployment statistics are based on estimates and are compiled to measure trends rather than actually to count people working. Civilian labor force statistics include non-military workers and unemployed Kentuckians who are actively seeking work. They do not include unemployed Kentuckians who have not looked for employment within the past four weeks. The data should only be compared to the same month county in previous years.
