To assure the payment of the Bonds it is necessary that the Board of Education authorize the levy of a tax ("Bond Tax" sufficient to pay debt service on the Bonds; provided nowever, it is now anticipated that other available taxes and evenues of the Board of Edu cation will be sufficient to mee he debt service requirements of the Bonds without the col ection of the Bond Tax.

That pursuant to Section 157 of the Constitution of Kentucky and KRS § 66.111, there is nereby authorized to be levied and the Board hereby does so evy, without limitation as to ate or amount, each year tha he Bonds remain outstanding a Tax in an amount sufficien provide for the full paymen of the principal and interést re-quirements on said Bonds rovided, however, that said ax shall be collected only to he extent that other receipts rom existing Board taxes o other sources are not suffi cient to provide for the full pay nent of the debt service pay nents on the Bonds each year

hat by the adoption of the Resolution the Board of Edu ation covenants with Owners of the Bonds that it shall, if ne cessary, collect each year a Bond Tax in a sufficien amount and appropriate in its annual budget, together with other monies available to it, ar amount of funds sufficient to pay the "debt charges" on the Bonds as defined in Sectior 66.011 (4) of the Kentucky Re

The Bonds are to be sold at a publicly advertised competitive sale. The Bonds will mature over a term not to exceed 20 ears. The Resolution estab ishes a Sinking Fund to provide for the payment of the principal and interest require nents of the Bonds as same ecome due.

ORDINANCE NO. 2025-09-04(A)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 74 OF THE CITY OF SHELBYVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATING TO FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION

This Ordinance revises the definition of "Substantial Improvement" in Section 74.005 of the Shelbyville

Any reconstruction, rehabilitation, addition, or other improvement of a structure, taking place during a 5-year period in which the cumulative percentage of improvements equals or exceeds fifty (50) percent of the market value of the structure before the "start of construction" of the improvement. This term includes structures which have incurred "substantial damage", regardless of the actual  $repair\ work\ performed.\ The\ term\ does\ not,\ however,\ include\ either:$ 

a.) Any project for improvement of a structure to correct existing violations of state or local health, sanitary, or safety code specifications which have been identified by the local Code Enforcement Official and which are the minimum necessary to assure safe living conditions, or

 $b.) The FIS and FIRMs are available for review at the Shelbyville Public Works Department, 787 Kentucky Street, Shelbyville, Kentucky 40065, and the full text of this ordinance may be reviewed at Shelbyville City Hall, 315 Washington Street, Shelbyville, Kentucky 40065.
