Efforts are ongoing on a plan to improve traffic conditions at the new Woodford County High School during the arrival and dismissal of students in the mornings and afternoons, Jones told board members. Her comments came prior to the board approving a

sidewalk extension from the back of the high school to the three-way stop in front of the middle school, which Jones described as a key location where someone will be placed to direct traffic. The cost of the sidewalk extension change order is \$66,840, according to information given to the board. Board member KT Gould thanked Jones for facilitating

a conversation with Versailles Police Chief Rob Young and others to improve traffic conditions at the high school. "It's very important," said Jones. "We have to all work together." Earlier, Smith said the new high school building has a few punch list items, including HVAC controls, that need to be completed before the project is finished.

With former project manager Clay Ratliff no longer working for Trace Creek Construction, Smith was asked if Trace Creek has remained involved in making sure all of the work gets completed. The job superintendent from Trace

Creek has taken the lead on the project, Smith said, and "I deal with some folks from Trace Creek's headquarters" on the administrative side. 'I think they're probably like we are," Smith said. "We're ready to get everything wrapped up (on the project) and get

everything functioning properly.'

In response to a question from Gould, Jones said special needs students would not be penalized in those situations. Standards for superintendent

The board approved Effective Standards for Kentucky School Superintendents after watching a video that explained

the support offered by the Kentucky Association of School Administrators in this evaluation process. Jones said she will be evaluated based on five standards, and she will work with the board on a professional growth plan specific to the needs of this school year. Also, Jones said she will complete a capstone project and be mentored by Fred Carter, a retired superintendent with a

wealth of knowledge.
