• Penny Faye Ware, 49, of Danville, was indicted on charges of strangulation in the second degree and four counts of assault in the fourth degree. The alleged offenses occurred on November 10, 2025, in Garrard County. Ware is accused of wantonly impeding the breathing of a victim by applying pressure to his throat or neck, and of causing physical injury to four individuals. Her arraignment is scheduled for February 20, 2026, at 9:00 a.m. The Commonwealth's witness was Officer Adam Jarboe of the Lancaster Police Department.

• Jason Turner, 39, of Lancaster, was indicted for possession of a controlled substance in the first degree

(third or subsequent offense) and public intoxication. On September 29, 2025, Turner allegedly possessed methamphetamine and was found manifestly under the influence of a controlled substance in a public setting. His arraignment is set for February 20, 2026, at 9:00 a.m. Officer Robbie Tudor of the Lancaster Police Department testified on behalf of the Commonwealth.

• James Telford, 59, of Medford, New York, faces indictments for theft of identity and theft by unlawful taking over \$1,000. On December 18, 2024, Telford allegedly used the identifying information of Jeffrey Cruze to make financial transactions and took over \$1,000 in cash belonging to Cruze. His arraignment is scheduled for February 20, 2026, at 9:00 a.m. Officer Jeremy Smith of the Lancaster Police Department was the testifying witness.

• Tanya Yocum, 43, of

Lancaster, was indicted for possession of a controlled substance in the first degree. She allegedly possessed methamphetamine on August 25, 2025, in Garrard County. Yocum's arraignment is set for February 20, 2026, at 9:00 a.m. Officer Jeremy Smith of the Lancaster Police Department testified in the case.

• Dakota Tunnell, 19, of Crab Orchard, was indicted for wanton endangerment in the first degree. On October 12, 2025, Tunnell allegedly pointed a handgun at another person's head, creating a substantial risk of death or serious physical injury. His arraignment is scheduled for February 20, 2026, at 9:00 a.m. Officer A. Pingleton of the Lancaster Police Department testified for the Commonwealth.

• William Oscar Seals, 56, of Berea, was indicted on four charges: possession of a controlled substance in the

first degree, possession of drug paraphernalia, operating a vehicle with an expired registration plate, and failure to produce an insurance card. The alleged offenses occurred on June 19, 2025. According to the indictment, Seals was found with methamphetamine, a glass smoking pipe, and a black zip-up container, and lacked proper vehicle documentation. His arraignment is scheduled for February 20, 2026, at 9:00 a.m. Trooper S. Owens of the Kentucky State Police testified in the case.

• Maritza Caban, 45, of Lancaster, was indicted on two counts of theft by deception over \$1,000 and one count of theft by deception under \$1,000. The alleged offenses took place on February 14, 17, and 18, 2025. Caban is accused of depositing worthless checks into her account at First Southern National Bank and withdrawing or using the funds. Her arraignment is

scheduled for February 20, 2026, at 9:00 a.m. Deputy J. Smith of the Garrard County Sheriff's Office appeared before the grand jury as a witness.

• Jenarosa Pomarico, 18, of Harrodsburg, was indicted for assault in the second degree. On October 12, 2025, Pomarico allegedly caused serious physical injury to another person. Her arraignment is set for February 20, 2026, at 9:00 a.m. Officer A. Pingleton of the Lancaster Police Department provided testimony before the grand

jury. These indictments reflect a continued effort by local law enforcement and the Commonwealth's Attorney's office to address a range of criminal activity within Garrard County.

Formal court proceedings for each defendant will move forward following arraignment.

Located Safe From Front

Officials commended the collaborative response among the agencies involved, highlighting the professionalism and dedication of all units who contributed to the swift resolution. Special acknowledgment was also ex-

tended to Bluegrass 911 Communications for their role in assisting with the operation.

The incident underscores the critical value of interagency cooperation in emergency situations and the continued commitment of first responders to the safety and well-being of Garrard County residents.

Assault From Front

officers responded to a call from the victim's father, who reported that his two daughters had been physically struck by their stepfather, Don Allen Moyers.

The citation states that officers made contact with Moyers at his residence on Highland Avenue shortly after 4:45 p.m. on the day of the incident. Moyers reportedly told police that a verbal altercation had occurred with one of the juvenile females, during which he admitted to striking her in the head and later in the face. The impact allegedly caused the child to hit the side of her head on a door.

The report further indicates that while officers were present at the residence, they overheard

a phone conversation between Moyers and his wife. During the call, Moyers was heard saying, "You know how we normally smack her in the face..."

Emergency Medical Services were requested by the biological father to assess the juvenile at the residence. Although the juvenile reported experiencing physical pain in her head and on her hand, the citation notes that there was only slight redness with no visible bruising or injuries requiring further medical treatment.

Moyers was arrested at the scene and charged with one count of assault in the fourth degree (domestic violence) with minor injury. The case will be handled in Garrard County District Court.
