
35 YEARS AGO, 1991

100 YEARS AGO, 1926

A.F. Money, as administrator of Mattie Hardesty, sold 10 shares of stock in the Deposit Bank of Eminence at \$126 a share and as administrator of W.M. Duvall, two shares of stock in the Bank of Finchville at \$97... Fire destroyed the two-and-a-half-story frame residence of 14 rooms on the Harrisdale farm, 6 miles northeast of Shelbyville. The house was occupied by J.T. Graves and family and Peter Kapp, and was owned by the Rothschild brothers... The Rev. C.W. Eley of Lexington accepted the call as pastor of the Shelbyville First Baptist Church... Josh F. Campbell purchased the farm of the late Elizabeth Carpenter near Olive Branch Church... Harry Kenneth Glass, 5-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. John Glass of Louisville, died at the home of his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. J.C. McAllister, near Mount Eden.


