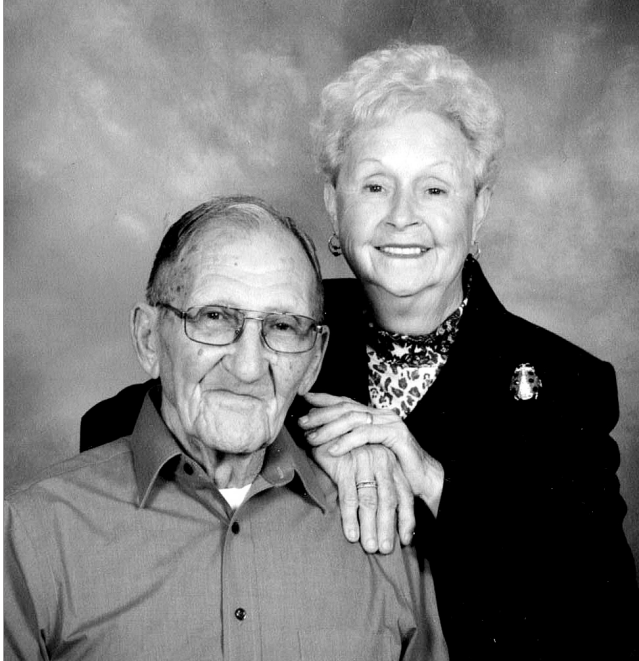
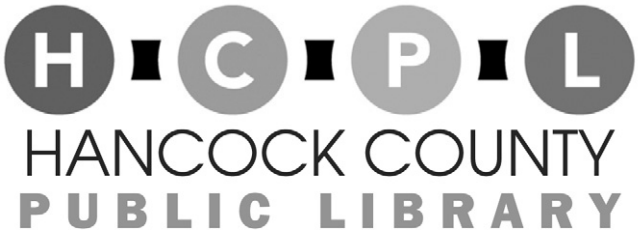




Bolings will celebrate 65th anniversary

Changes coming to renew personalized plates in Kentucky

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — Kentucky officials say a change is coming for people looking to renew personalized license plates.

The Transportation Cabinet says personalized plates will transition to a birth month expiration next year to comply with action by

state lawmakers. Officials say the change brings personalized plates in line with standard-issue plates.

Currently, personalized plates expire annually on Dec. 31 and applicants must renew their registration at their county clerk's office between Nov. 15 and Dec. 31.

Beginning in January, people with January, February or March birthdays will renew personalized plates in person or online anytime between their birth month and April 30, 2019. All others will renew by the last day of their birth month.

By 2020, all applicants will renew by the last day of their birth month.

Judge: Bevin must disclose screenshots of blocked accounts

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — A federal judge has ordered Kentucky's governor to turn over screenshots of social media accounts he has blocked.

Two Kentucky residents with the help of the American Civil Liberties Union have sued Bevin, arguing he violated their First Amendment rights by blocking them on social media.

Monday, Federal Magistrate Edward B. Atkins granted the ACLU's request for Bevin to turn over screenshots of blocked users' comments. He also ordered Bevin to disclose text and email messages about his social media policy and a list of keywords he uses to hide comments on Facebook. He denied the ACLU's request to have Bevin testify.

Earlier this year, U.S. District Judge Gregory F. Van Tatenhove denied the ACLU's request for a preliminary injunction, ruling they were not likely to win the case.

Avoid using a mixer or blender when mashing potatoes; they are more likely to be gluey. Gently mash potatoes by hand or with a ricer.

Delicious Mashed Potatoes can be frozen. When removed from the freezer allow to thaw in the refrigerator. Place in an oven proof dish and heat in oven or microwave. Stir and add pats of butter. You will never know they were frozen.

Delicious Mashed Potatoes

2 1/2 pounds potatoes (I prefer Yukon Gold)
1/3 cup butter
4 oz. cream cheese, softened
1/4 – 1/3 cups half and half
1/4 teaspoon seasoned salt
1/4 – 1/2 teaspoon pepper
1/8 – 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder

Peel and cut the potatoes into pieces that are generally the same size. Bring a large pot of water to a simmer and

ing, place them back into the dry pot and put the pot on the stove. Mash the potatoes over low heat, allowing all the steam to escape, before adding in all the other ingredients. Turn off the stove and add 1/3 stick of butter, a 4-ounce package of cream cheese and about 1/3 cup of half-and-half. Mash, mash, mash! Next, add about 1/4 teaspoon of seasoned salt and 1/4 a teaspoon of black pepper. Stir well and place in a medium-sized baking dish. Throw a few pats of butter over the top of the potatoes and place them in a 350-degree oven and heat until butter is melted, and potatoes are warmed through.
