## SHERIFF REPORT

### HARRISON COUNTY SHERIFF'S REPORT

#### Traffic Cases

Aug. 6-Dep. Shannon Clem worked a single-vehicle accident on McDowell Road, two miles west of Cynthiana. Justin Colemire, Mt. Olivet, said a bee flew into his vehicle which distracted him, causing him to run off the right side of the roadway and strike a tree, head-on, then rolling onto its side in a creek.

He attempted to veer right to avoid rear-ending the Poe vehicle, but clipped the side of the vehicle, before running off the roadway and into a ditch.

As he was crossing, he failed to see a Nicholas County Police cruiser, driven by Chief William Denton, who was driving east bound on KY 32.
