GRAVES COUNTY VOTER REGISTRATION NUMBERS

The voter registration statistics from the Kentucky State Board of Elections gave insight to the percentages of Democratic, Republican, Independent, and 'other' voting registrations during the last few summer months of registrations and the turnout during Primary election.

The Primary election in May saw 12,870 Democratic voters, 11,459 Republican voters, and 1,906 independent voters, for a total of 26,145 registered voters.

From the month of June, the 30 precincts in Graves County saw a total of 12,663 Democratic registrations, 11,589 Republican registrations, and 1923 for other registrations, for a total of 26,175 registrations.

For the month of July, the 30 precincts in Graves County saw a total of 12,619 Democratic registrations, 11,595 Republican registrations, and 1929 for other registrations, for a total of 26,143 registrations.

The end of the year registration of 2022 saw 13,319 democratic registrations, 11,611 republican registrations, and 1928 for other registrations, totaling 26,858 registrations at the end of the year.
