ORDINANCE 2023-12

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MT. WASHINGTON, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY AMENDING MT. WASHINGTON CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 71.05 (A) GENERAL SPEED LIMIT AND CHAPTER 74 SCHEDULE I SPEED LIMITS

SECTION I: WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Mt. Washington has deemed it necessary to add provisions to the code of ordinances to decrease the speed limit on North Bardstown Road beginning at Owen Lane to Ranch Road within the city limits of Mt. Washington, KY due to the recommendations of Engineers in preparations for a roundabout.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNT WASHINGTON, KENTUCKY THAT CHAPTER 71.05 GENERAL SPEED LIMIT AND CHAPTER 74 SCHEDULE I IS AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

§ 71.05 GENERAL SPEED LIMIT.

(A) No person shall operate a motor vehicle on any street or other public way in the city at a greater speed than 25 miles per hour, except on those streets listed in Chapter 74, Schedule I, or unless a different speed limit has been lawfully posted by the state or the county.

§ 74: TRAFFIC SCHEDULES

SCHEDULE I. SPEED LIMITS.

(A) Speed limits are established as follows on the following streets:

North Bardstown Road (31EX)	Beginning at Owen Road north to Ranch Road	55 40		

SECTION II: This Ordinance shall be published according to law.

SECTION III: The effective date of this Ordinance shall be the date on which the Ordinance is approved by the City Council of the City of Mt. Washington and published according to law.

SECTION IV: Should any section, clause, line, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the same shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION V: The City Clerk is hereby authorized to publish this ordinance in accordance with the Kentucky Revised Statutes.
