to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Kentucky is ranked 5th in the nation with Mississippi being #1 despite the southern state being ranked 35th in water fluoridation.

While science is and should be ever-changing, it usually leaves us with more questions than answers. After all these decades, the science still conflicts in so many critical areas and those "three letter agencies' often promote the push for more chemicals and more pharmaceuticals.

For this reason, many have been anxiously awaiting Robert Kennedy's shake-up at the federal level if Senate Republicans actually give him the green light as Secretary of Health and Human Services after President-Elect Donald Trump chose him for this position. Only time will tell what, if any, positive changes can be born from such a choice. Kennedy has been a longtime advocate for health especially as it relates to our environment and chemicals, and he's certainly not shy to call a spade a spade.

These statistics are not an end-all for answers or decisions on your child's healthcare but it is the opening of a door for those who are curious. It would be interesting to see if there are correlations between the increase
