ORDINANCE NO. 2024-09
AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING REGULATIONS DESIGNED TO

ESSEN OR AVOID HAZARDS TO PERSONS AND PROP ERTY CAUSED BY FLOODING AND TO OTHERWISE PRO-MOTE THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, AND GENERAL WEL-ARE OF THE CITIZENS OF THE CITY OF NEW HAVEN.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2024-09 creates a standalone ordinance to authorize the County Engineer to administer the provisions of floodplain administration for the City of New Haven, and to appoint the County Engineer to be the Floodplain Administrator for the City of New Haven. The ordinance also enacts provisions for carrying out the administration of floodplain activities within the municipal boundaries of the City of New Haven and authorizes ees and penalties to enforce compliance with the regulations set orth therein.

THEREFORE, be it ordained by the New Haven Board of Com nissioners, Commonwealth of Kentucky, this ordinance shall be effective upon passage, and will be advertised pursuant to
