AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF VANCEBURG, KENTUCKY, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 220.10 ALTERING DEFINITIONS AND

NOW THEREFORE let it be ordained by the Common Council of the City of

VANCEBURG, Kentucky, as follows:

SECTION 1: That Ordinance No. 220.10, Section 1, subsection 2, is hereby

"Business" means any enterprise, activity, trade, occupation, profession or undertaking of any nature conducted for gain or profit. "Business" shall not include the usual activities of board trade, chambers of commerce, trade associations, or unions, or

other associations performing services usually performed by trade associations or unions. "Business" shall not include funds, foundations, corporations, or associations organized and operated for the exclusive and sole purpose of religious, charitable, scientific, literary, educational, civic or fraternal purposes, where no part of the earnings, incomes or receipts of such unit, group, or association, inures to the benefit of any private shareholder or other person.

Notwithstanding any other language within this section or any other section the term "business" shall include any and all educational institutions, colleges and universities, educational foundations, school boards, or any other entity whose primary purpose is education, which is located within the City of Vanceburg, Kentucky.

"Business entity" means each separate corporation, limited liability company, business development corporation, partnership, limited partnership, registered limited liability partnership, sole proprietorship, association, joint stock company, receivership, trust, professional service organization, or other legal entity through which business is

Employees shall also mean any person employed or paid by educational board, organization, institution, school, college, university, tutoring center, daycare, or preschool, as well as any officers, agents, board members, employees, independent contractors of any school board, school system, university system, daycare, pre-school, any school located within the city, and any associated entities or subdivisions of the aforementioned entities without limitation whatsoever.

Employer shall also mean school board, school system, university system, daycare, pre-school, any school located within the city, and any associated entities or subdivisions of the aforementioned entities without limitation whatsoever.

SECTION 2: That all ordinances in conflict herewith are specifically hereby repealed to the extent of said conflict only.

SECTION 3: That each section and each sentence of this ordinance is enacted separately and the invalidity and/or unconstitutionality of any one particular sentence and/or section shall not affect the validity and/or constitutionality of any other sentence and/or section.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage. approval and publication according to law
