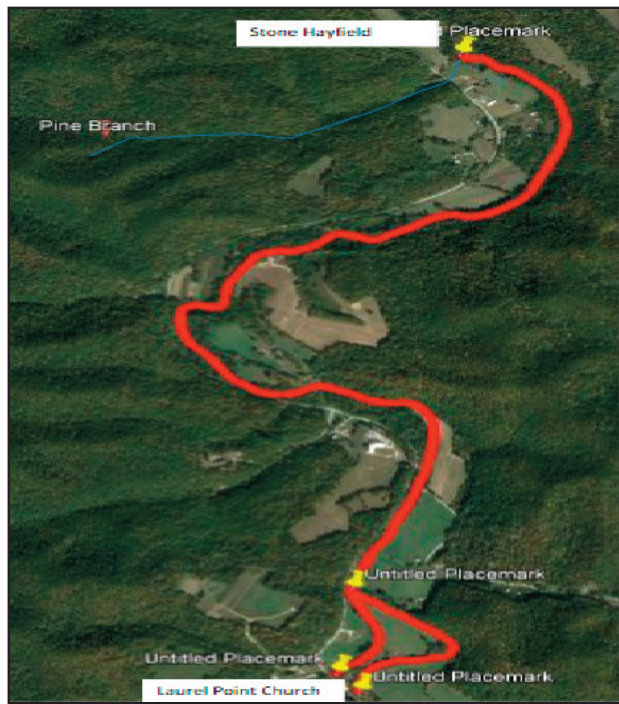
Answer: Norman Julius. Until next week this is the Old Righthander leaving you with this thought, "You cannot get ahead while you are trying to get even."

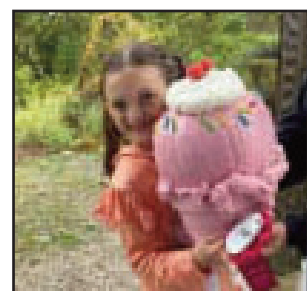

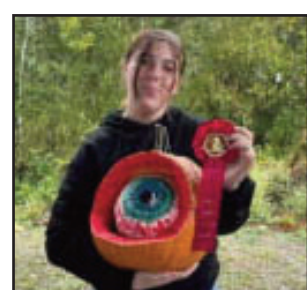

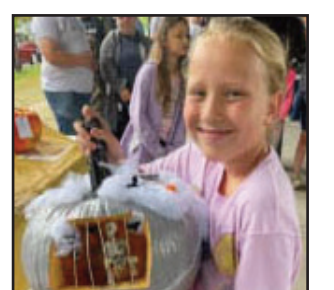

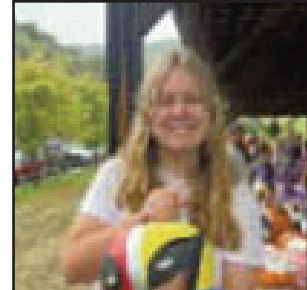
