Tollesboro Lions Club aiding disaster relief, in a non-conventional way

If you drive by the Tollesboro Lions Club in the near future, you will notice a number of EDS (Emergency Disaster Services) trailers parked in rows on the fairgrounds. This is as EDS needed a place to park them as they make their way from Florida and other areas affected by weather conditions brought on by Hurricanes Helene and Milton. As these trailers make their way back to their home base in Maysville, repairs, maintenance, and winterization must take place before being parked in their Maysville warehouses. This is a time-consuming operation and will result in trailers being parked on the fairgrounds until they can be brought to Maysville in an orderly fashion to undergo the repair/maintenance/winterization processes.

Trailers currently in place are 30 packs (5 door units each providing for 6 bunkbed areas for providing sleeping quarters to those

set up in camps for workers and displaced families) and 7 packs (7 door units with each unit providing for liv-

ing quarters for seven persons, including FEMA workers and disaster assistance/relief planners).

Grand Jury



The Lewis County Grand Jury has returned indictments against two individuals.

Ricky A. Rose, 48, was charged with one count of assault, 3rd degree, a Class D felony, violation code 13152, by assaulting a peace officer with a large knife; one count of possession of controlled substance, 1st degree, a Class D felony, violation code 42201, by knowingly and unlawfully possessing methamphetamine, a controlled substance; one count of alcohol intoxication, a violation, violation code 02304, by being in a public place manifestly under the influence of alcohol to the degree that he may endanger himself or other persons or property; one count of public intoxication, a Class B misdemeanor, violation code 02303, by appearing in a public place manifestly under the influence of controlled substance to the degree that he may endanger himself or other persons or property; one count of resisting arrest, a Class A misdemeanor, violation code 02404, by intentionally attempting to prevent a peace officer, acting under color of his official authority, from affecting an arrest; one count persistent felony offender, 1st degree, violation code 73101, by being more than twenty-one years of age and having been convicted of or completed service of a sentence for two or more felonies within five years prior to the date of commission of the felony for which he now

stands charged.

Brian D. Dummitt, 28, of Quincy, was charged with one count of fleeing or evading police, 1st degree, a Class D felony, violation code 00196, by operating a motor vehicle with the intent to elude or flee and knowingly or wantonly disobeying a direction to stop their motor vehicle given by a person recognized to be a police officer and in so doing was driving under the influence of alcohol or another substance, driving while license was suspended for violating KRS 189A.090, and by fleeing or eluding, was the cause, or created a substantial risk of serious physical injury or death to any person or property; one count operating a motor vehicle under the influence of intoxicating beverages, drugs or a combination of substances which impairs one's driving ability, 4th or subsequent offense, with aggravating circumstances, a Class D felony, violation code 03182, by operating or being in actual physical control of a motor vehicle in this state while under the influence of alcohol, drugs or a combination of substances which impairs one's driving abilities while having at least three prior convictions for the same offense within the previous ten years and while one or more of the aggravating factors enumerated in KRS 189A.010(11) were present; one count driving on DUI suspended license, 3rd offense, while intoxicated, a Class D felony, violation code 02620, by operating or being in actual physical control of a motor vehicle while his license was revoked or

suspended under KRS Chapter 189A, while having at least two prior convictions for the same offense and at the time of this offense he was in violation KRS 189A.010; one count no insurance, an unclassified misdemeanor, violation code 00480, by operating a motor vehicle on the highway without minimum liability insurance coverage required by statute; one count speeding, a violation, violation code 00100, by driving on a highway in excess of the posted speed limit.

A Grand Jury indictment is a formal accusation of a crime and does not establish guilt.

NOTICE OF HEARING ON APPLICATION FOR PERMIT TO OPERATE A PLACE OF ENTERTAINMENT

Please take notice that on October 21, 2024, an Application for Permit to Operate a Place of Entertainment was filed by Tony Palarie and Jonathan Ruggles. The application seeks a permit to operate a business known as 1806 Adventures, LLC. The primary purpose of the business is to provide trail riding and primitive camping to paying customers, allowing individuals to drive their own vehicles over developed trails.

The location of the proposed business is 1979 Briary Creek Road, Vanceburg, in Lewis County, Kentucky.

KRS 231.080 requires that a hearing be held after the expiration of thirty (30) days from the date on which the application is filed. Said written allegations shall be filed in the office of the County Judge Executive, Second Floor, Lewis County Courthouse, prior to 2:30 p.m. on November 21, 2024.
