Smith is a four-star transfer portal prospect ranked the 38th best transfer in the country and 10th best point guard on the market per 247sports' transfer portal rankings.

He told 24/7 High School Hoops he has heard from Kentucky, Villanova, Florida, Creighton, St. John's, Miami, Wake Forest, NC State, Kansas State, Washington, Louisville, and VCU since entering the transfer portal last Friday.

With the Utes this past season, he played in 28 games, starting 21 in which he averaged 13.3 points per game, 7.1 assists, 6.3 rebounds, and 1.1 steals per game while shooting 46.7% from the field, 40.8% from three, and 67.7% from the free throw line.

He scored a season-high 28 points and grabbed seven rebounds in a season-ending loss to Indiana State in the NIT, logged a double-double with 24 points and 11 rebounds while also dishing eight assists in a regular season win over Oregon and on the year logged a total of eight double-doubles and one triple-double which

came in a win over Stanford in which he scored 16 points, dished 11 assists and grabbed 10 rebounds.

AIDEN MAHANEY

Saint Mary's transfer Aidan Mahaney who is a 6-foot-3 shooting guard, is also expected to visit Lexington over the weekend while BYU transfer Richie Saunders was on campus earlier this week and has received two 247sports crystal ball projections in favor of the Wildcats.

Despite a slow start, Mahaney helped guide the Gaels to a WCC regular season title with a 15-1 record in league play while he put up a team-high 13.9 points and 2.6 assists per game. He was All-WCC Tournament after averaging 16.5 points on 56.5% shooting from the floor in the Gaels' two wins over Santa Clara and Gonzaga, claiming the program's first conference tournament championship since 2019.

Mahaney averaged 15.5 points in five games against the Zags in his career, including two 20-point games this past season. He put up 20 points in a 64-62 win at The Kennel on Feb. 3 and 23 points in a 69-60

victory in the WCC Tournament championship game.

ANDREW CARR

Pope will also be welcoming Wake Forest transfer forward Andrew Carr to Lexington this weekend for an official visit.

This past season, Carr started all 35 games for the Deacons and averaged a career-high 13.5 points per game, 6.8 rebounds, 1.5 assists and 1.5 blocks per game. He shot 52.6% from the field, 37.1% from three and 78.1% from the free throw line. Carr scored a season-high 31 points in a season-ending loss to Georgia in the NIT and went for 28 in a loss to eventual Final Four qualifier NC State.

ANDREJ STOJAKOVIC

Kentucky is in the final three for Stanford trans-

fer Andrej Stojakovic, who will visit UK this weekend, according to Joe Tipton of On3 Sports.

The former McDonald's All-American and son of 3-time NBA All-Star Peja Stojakovic, took an official visit to California last weekend, and is also considering North Carolina.

Stojakovic, who is ranked as the No. 50 overall transfer in the portal by 247Sports, averaged 7.8 points and 3.4 rebounds while shooting 40.9% from the field and 33.7% from 3-point range while playing 32 games for the Cardinal with 10 starts as a freshman this season.

He was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Week on Dec. 18 following a Dec. 17 performance that saw him score 17 points on 7-of-11

shooting, including 3-of-6 from 3, with four rebounds and two assists in a win over Idaho. The 6-foot-7 wing

scored a season-high 20 points with six rebounds and three assists in a 99-68 home win over USC.

INSPECTION PERIOD FOR THE PROPERTY TAX ASSESSMENT ROLL

The Daviess County real property tax roll will be opened for inspection from May 6 through May 20, 2024. Under the supervision of the Property Valuation Administrator or one of the deputies, any person may inspect the tax roll.

This is the January 1, 2024, assessment on which state, county, and school taxes for 2024 will be due.

The tax roll is in the office of the property valuation administrator in the county courthouse and may be inspected between the hours of 8:00 AM- 4:30 PM & Saturday May 11th & 18th between 8:00 AM and 12:00 PM.

Any taxpayer desiring to appeal an assessment on real property made by the PVA must first request a conference with the PVA or a designated deputy. The conference may be held prior to or during the inspection period.

The taxpayer can appeal his/her assessment by filing in person, filing via phone or sending a letter or other written petition stating the reasons for appeal, identifying the property and stating the taxpayer's opinion of the fair cash value of the property.

Any taxpayer still aggrieved by an assessment on real property, after the conference with the PVA or designated deputy, may appeal to the county board of assessment appeals.

The appeal must be filed with the county clerk's office no later than one work day following the conclusion of the inspection period (May 21, 2024).

A taxpayer failing to appeal to the county board of assessment appeals, or failing to appear before the board, either in person or by designated representative, will not be eligible to appeal directly to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.

Appeals of personal property assessments shall not be made to the county board of assessment appeals. Personal property taxpayers shall be served notice under the provisions of KRS 132.450(4) and shall have the protest and appeal rights granted under the provisions of KRS 131.110.

The following steps should be taken when a taxpayer does not agree with the assessed value of personal property as determined by the property valuation administrator.

- (1) He must list under protest (for certification) what he believes to be the fair cash value of his property.
- (2) He must file a written protest directly with the Department of Revenue, Office of Property Valuation within 30 days from the date of the notice of assessment.
- (3) This protest must be in accordance with KRS 131.110
- (4) The final decision of the Department of Revenue may be appealed to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.

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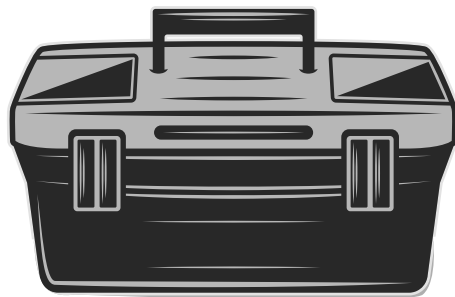
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
