Brock Travelstead kicked a 20-yard field goal to make it 10-0.

U of L was able to keep Boley and his eventual replacement Gavin Wimsett under duress most of the game. Boley was 4-of-9 for 125 yards, but threw another pick late in the second quarter.

"Obviously, we were getting too close to him," U of L defensive lineman Ashton Gillotte said. "That's the thing with young quarterbacks. I mean, he's talented. But if you can keep pressure on him, a young guy makes mistakes. I think that's what we did today. I think that's what shows in the scorecard."

Watson's 57-yard touchdown run early in the second quarter gave Louisville a 17-0 lead and Brock Travelstead's 21-yard field goal made it 20-0 at intermission.

"Give Louisville credit," UK coach Mark Stoops said. "I

knew going into it they had a very good team. I'm sure they were motivated to come in and play very well, and they did. You can tell it's a veteran team led by a very experienced seventh-year quarterback that managed the game very well. Jeff and his staff did a very nice job keeping us off balance (being) very multiple in the run game, mixing it up. With all the turnovers we didn't give ourselves a good shot."

UK, which couldn't muster much offense and had four three-and-outs in the first half, finally showed some life on its first series of the second half. Wimsett, a little-used transfer from Rutgers, replaced Boley and threw a 4-yard touchdown pass to Mori Maclin with 9:22 left in the third quarter to cap a 73-yard drive and pull the Cats to within 20-7. Suddenly, the home team had momentum and the crowd of 58,612 to life got involved again.

But 4½ minutes later, U of L linebacker Stanquan Clark ripped the ball out of Maclin's hands and defensive lineman

Ramon Puryear, a former walk-on from Eastern High School in Louisville, picked it up off the ground for a 19-yard scoop-and-score and a 27-7 Cardinal lead that sucked the life out of both the Cats and the crowd. It was Puryear's third TD of his career and UK never threatened again.

"This is definitely something I've envisioned since I was a kid so this just feels great," Puryear said. "It feels like a Disney movie. It's wonderful, something we prepared for. We knew going into this game we were going to have opportunities to create turnovers."

"Our local guy takes it in for the score; that was really big," Brohm said. "He's been a tremendous player for us ever since I've been here. He gives great effort and makes big plays. To play the way these guys did was just a great way to finish the season. I'm proud of that effort by our players, proud of our coaches. We've worked hard to grind through this season. To win against our rival is big."

committed by UofL's Thor Griffith.

Gavin Wimsatt entered and hit Ja'Mori Maclin for a 44-yard gain and two plays later connected with him again for a four-yard touchdown.

Down 20-7, Kentucky got the ball back on its own 14-yard-line down 20-7 with just over five minutes left in the quarter.

Then running back Jamarion Wilcox fumbled for the second time on the afternoon on the first play of the Wildcats drive, and the ball was scooped up and scored by Louisville's Ramon Puryear for a 20-yard touchdown to make it 27-7 Cardinals.

The play ended any hopes of a UK comeback.

"We get the game to 20-7, get a little bit of momentum and get a little hope, and it goes away quickly with another

turnover," Stoops said. "You just can't do that. You can't do that in any game, let alone a rivalry game."

Kentucky finished the day, committing five turnovers and allowing Louisville's freshmen running back duo of Isaac Brown and Duke Watson to combine to rush for 282 yards and four touchdowns, with Brown rushing for 176 yards and two scores to win Game MVP honors.

With the loss, UK finishes the 2024 season 4-8, the second worst of the Stoops era. The campaign is only better than Stoops' debut season of 2013 when the Wildcats finished 2-10.

"I know the year was very frustrating to a lot of people, to our fan base, they were wonderful and

stuck with us the entire year, once again out there today, and sorry we did not deliver a better performance than that today and throughout the season," Stoops said. "We've got to go back to work."

"We've got to go back to being who we are, and we've got to be very tough and very discipl-

ined and very fundamental. We weren't always that this year and it wasn't very good. I

understand that. It's very frustrating. I understand that and I accept the responsibility of that."
