The Whitley County Grand Jury has handed down a 15-count indictment against a London man, who allegedly engaged in an armed standoff with the Corbin Police Department and Kentucky State Police last month.

The Whitley County Grand Jury issued its monthly report Thursday and indicted Michael Leforce, 34, of London, charging him with one count of attempted murder, five counts of attempted murder of a police officer, five counts of first-degree wanton endangerment, possession of a handgun by a convicted felon, tampering with physical evidence, and third-degree terroristic threatening.

The incident began about 9:41 p.m. on Jan. 24 when Corbin police received a shots fired complaint at 1014 Circle Drive. The caller reported that a male subject was inside an outbuilding on the property and firing guns from the outbuilding, according to an arrest citation.

When Patrolman Chris Brown arrived at the scene, he made contact with Leforce, who was standing in the doorway of an outbuilding with his right arm inside the doorway out of sight.

Brown told Leforce to show him his hands and come out and speak with him, but Leforce started yelling that he wanted to speak with his daughter and refused to comply with verbal directions. Brown then retreated to his patrol cruiser for cover until additional units could arrive.

Then Sgt. Jeff Hill, Cpl. Bradley Prewitt, and Patrolman Wayne Bird arrived on scene, and officers again attempted to make contact with Leforce to get him to comply.

“While Sgt. Hill and I were communicating behind a parked vehicle, officers heard two gunshots come from inside the outbuilding. With assistance from Kentucky State Police Trooper Donnie Jones, officers were able to persuade (Leforce) to exit the outbuilding where officers took him into custody without incident,” Brown wrote on an arrest citation.

The arrest citation indicates that Leforce was arrested at 2:01 a.m. on Jan. 25.

Drug involvement is suspected, according to an arrest citation.

After Leforce was in custody, Brown spoke with the victim, who reported that Leforce had allegedly gotten into an argument with her trying to get the keys to her vehicle. When she told him no, he allegedly threatened to shoot her and shot a handgun twice in her direction, according to an arrest citation.

A witness, who lives nearby, told police she saw Leforce allegedly shoot twice in the direction of the victim, who was running away from the outbuilding. The witness then called 911, Brown wrote on the citation.

Police learned that two adult females and an adult male were present in a nearby residence that was in the direction of where Leforce allegedly fired shots. They also learned that three adult females were present in the residence at 1014 Circle Drive when Leforce allegedly fired shots, the citation stated.

The grand jury also indicted Leforce for first-degree persistent felony offender. He has a prior felony conviction in Madison County in connection with a 2019 case, and two prior felony convictions in Estill County in connection with 2013 and 2014 cases, according to his indictment.

In addition, the grand jury handed down indictments against a Williamsburg man in connection with two separate cases.

The grand jury indicted Kelvin Hill, 36, of Williamsburg, charging him with obscuring the identity of a machine (Toyota truck missing the identifying VIN numbers), and receiving stolen property value over \$1,000 but less than \$10,000 (Toyota truck).

The grand jury also handed down an indictment in an unconnected case charging Hill with receiving stolen property value \$1,000 or more but less than \$10,000 (1996 Geo Tracker), second-degree criminal mischief (1996 Geo Tracker), and first-degree persistent felony offender.

He has two prior felony convictions in connection with 2014 and 2017 Whitley County cases, according to his indictment.

According to its monthly reports and indictments, the grand jury

handed down several other indictments Thursday against the following individuals, including:

- William Baker, 37, address listed as homeless – first-degree criminal possession of a forged instrument and theft by deception value \$500 or more but less than \$10,000 (taking \$6,355.62 in return for two forged checks written on the account of the City Utilities Commission).

- Tasha Satterfield, 35, of Williamsburg – first-degree bail jumping.

- Rodney Vanover, 26, of Williamsburg – first-degree criminal mischief (knowingly and unlawfully damaging metal railings owned by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet), and attempted theft by unlawfully taking value \$1,000 or more (attempting to take metal railing owed by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet).

- Tyler Davis, 24, and Stephanie Hutton, 46, both of Corbin – theft by unlawful taking value of \$1,000 or more (taking of a four-wheeler value of \$1,000 or more), and theft by deception value of \$1,000 or more but less than \$10,000 (knowingly and unlawfully stating that they had the title to a four-wheeler when they actually didn’t). Davis was also indicted for second-degree burglary (residence), two counts of third-degree burglary (outbuildings), and first-degree criminal mischief (damaging outbuilding causing loss of \$1,000 or more).

- Jackie Haynes, 60, of Williamsburg – five counts of first-degree wanton endangerment.

- Tommy Worley, 36, of Jellico, Tennessee – convicted felon in possession of a handgun (Taurus 9mm).

- Jodie Savage, 28, of Pembroke, North Carolina – receiving stolen property value of \$10,000 or more (2016 Ford Escape).

- Terrell Norton, 37, of Pontiac, Michigan – possession of a handgun by a convicted felon (Taurus 9mm), and first-degree persistent felony offender. He has prior felony convictions in Oakland County, Michigan, in connection with 2007 and 2019 cases.

- Tonya Goff, 40, of Corbin – tampering with physical evidence.

8 indicted on drug charges

The Whitley County Grand Jury indicted eight people on drug-related charges Thursday.

According to its monthly report and indictments, the following other individuals were indicted Thursday, including:

- Perry Valentour, 32, of Emmalena – second-offense, first-degree trafficking in a controlled substance (methamphetamine), possession of drug paraphernalia, theft of identity without consent and first-degree persistent felony offender. He has prior felony con-

victions in connection with 2009 and 2021 cases in Laurel County.

- Christopher Disney, 44, of Corbin – two counts of first-degree trafficking in a controlled substance (methamphetamine and fentanyl), third-degree possession of a controlled substance (Alprazolam), possession of drug paraphernalia and first-degree persistent felony offender. He has prior felony convictions in Knox County (pair of 2018 cases), Whitley County (2018 case) and Laurel County (2013 case).

- Richard Stanley, 49, of Corbin – second-offense,

first -degree trafficking in a controlled substance (methamphetamine), and possession of drug paraphernalia.

- Darrell Kidwell, 41, of LaFollette, Tennessee – second-degree trafficking in a controlled substance (suboxone), trafficking in marijuana more than eight ounces but less than five pounds, and possession of drug paraphernalia.

- Vanessa Klotz, 50, of Williamsburg – first-degree possession of a controlled substance (fentanyl).

- Scott M. Judy, 34, of Williamsburg – first-degree trafficking in a

controlled substance (methamphetamine).

- Cole Carmichael, 35, of Niota, Tennessee – first-degree possession of a controlled substance (fentanyl).

- Timothy Rainwater, 56, of Louisville – first-degree trafficking in a controlled substance (methamphetamine) and second-degree persistent felony offender. He has a prior felony conviction in a 2011 Whitley County case.
