LEGAL NOTICE

PEAKS MILL WATER DISTRICT CUSTOMER NOTICE

On December 6, 2023, the Kentucky Public Service Commission (PSC) accepted for filing Peaks Mill Water District's Peaks Mill District) application requesting to increase its revenue from water sales by \$151,691, an approximate increase of 20.86 percent. Peaks Mill District also proposed a Water Loss Reduction Surcharge of \$3.59 per customer per month. On May 28, 2024, Commission Staff determined Peaks Mill District would require an increase of \$203,877 or 28.28 percent in revenue from water sales. Commission Staff also included a revised Water Loss Reduction Surcharge of \$3.09 per customer per month. Peaks Mill District requests the PSC approve its recommended revenue requirements and that Peaks Mill District be allowed to implement the revised rates as follows:

The proposed rates shall not become effective until the Public Service Commission has issued an Order approving these rates. The rates will increase the monthly bill of a typical residential customer using 4,000 gallons a month from \$48.02 to \$61.22, an increase of

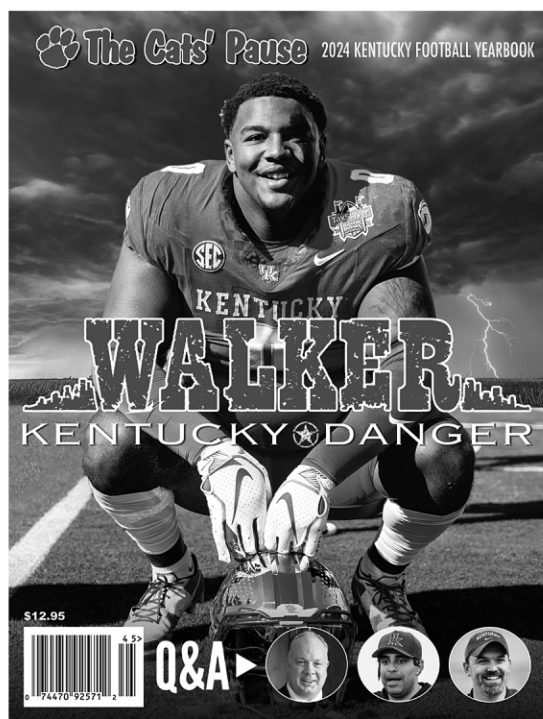
\$13.20, or approximately 27.49 percent. Additionally, including the Commission Staff's recommended surcharge of \$3.09, the rates will increase a typical residential customer's water bill from \$48.02 to \$64.31, an increase of \$16.29 or approximately 33.92 percent. Comments may also be submitted by electronic mail to psc.comment@ky.gov. If the Commission does not receive any request for intervention or hearing in this matter within 30 days after the date of publication of this customer notice, the Commission will proceed to render a decision in the matter.
