Dickerson guides Robert Morris past Northern Kentucky 97-93 in triple OT

MOON TOWNSHIP, Pa. — Amarion Dickerson had 27 points and 15 rebounds to help Robert Morris hold off Northern Kentucky 97-93 in triple overtime on Sunday.

Dickerson blocked five shots and had three steals for the Colonials (9-5, 1-2 Horizon League). Sophomore Alvaro Folgueiras scored 21 points and added a career-high 19 rebounds and six assists. DJ Smith had 13 points.

The Norse (7-7, 2-1) were led by LJ Wells, who finished with 19 points, 13 rebounds and two steals. Northern Kentucky also got 17 points and six rebounds from Trey Robinson.

Randall Pettus II had 17 points. The Norse saw a five-game win streak come to an end.

Dickerson's dunk gave Robert Morris a 94-92 lead with 26 seconds left in the third OT.

Dilen Miller made two free throws with 3 seconds left to wrap up the victory.

Josh Dilling made the second of two free throws with 8 seconds left for the Norse, forcing a second OT tied at 80. Wells hit a 3-pointer with 2:05 left and neither team scored after that, forcing the third OT tied at 86.

Michigan rolls to 112-64 victory over Western Kentucky

ANN ARBOR, Mich. — Vladislav Goldin and Nimari Burnett scored 17 points apiece and Tre Donaldson and Danny Wolf posted double-doubles to lead Michigan to a 112-64 romp over Western Kentucky on Sunday night, snapping a six-game win streak for the Hilltoppers.

Goldin made 7 of 8 shots with two 3-pointers and 1 of 2 free throws for the Wolverines (10-3), whose three losses this season have been by a combined five points. Burnett did most of his damage on 5-for-7 shooting from 3-point range. Donaldson totaled 12 points and 11 rebounds

for his first career double-double, while Wolf finished with 12 points and 10 boards for his sixth of the season.

Sam Walters scored 13 off the bench for Michigan and Roddy Gayle Jr. pitched in with 11 points and four assists.

Don McHenry sank three 3-pointers and scored 18 to lead Western Kentucky (9-4). Julius Thedford scored 11 on 3-for-16 shooting. Enoch Kalambay added 10 points.

Gayle and Goldin both had 11 points to guide Michigan to a 59-31 advantage at halftime.

The Wolverines shot 57.6% from

the floor and made 11 of 21 from 3-point range in posting their highest scoring half of the season.

The Wolverines topped the century mark on 3-pointer by Danny Wolf with 6:05 remaining for a 102-52 lead.

It was the first time the two teams squared off in 17 years. Michigan has won 4 of 6 all time against the Hilltoppers.

Michigan travels to play Southern California on Saturday in a Big Ten Conference matchup. Western Kentucky travels to play Liberty on Thursday in a Conference USA opener.

JAMES MADISON WINS 96-64 OVER MIDWAY

HARRISONBURG, Va. — Eddie Ricks III had 13 points in James Madison's 96-64 win over Midway on Sunday night.

Ricks added eight rebounds for the Dukes (7-6). Bryce Lindsay scored 13 points, going 5 of 9 (3 for 6 from 3-point range).

Elijah Hutchins-Everett went 5 of 10 from the field to finish with 12 points.

The Eagles were led by Miguel Shaw, who recorded 19 points and two steals.

Robbie Henry added 14 points and five steals for Midway.

Louisville set to face Washington in Sun Bowl after several key players opt out

EL PASO, Texas — Harrison Bailey is expected to start at quarterback for Louisville in the Sun Bowl against Washington, which means there won't be a final trip to Texas for Tyler Shough before he pursues an NFL career.

Before his final college season with the Cardinals (8-4), Shough spent three injury-plagued years at Texas Tech following his transfer from Oregon.

Shough's opt-out of Tuesday's game against the Huskies (6-6) opened the door for Bailey, who played sparingly in coach Jeff Brohm's first two seasons in a career

that started at Tennessee and continued at UNLV.

While Louisville landed former Southern California QB Miller Moss in the transfer portal, Brohm still sees the Sun Bowl as a 2025 audition for plenty of his players.

"It's important that they do play well if they want to get a position for next year," Brohm said. "They need to prove themselves in this football game, and we have to make decisions after that, according to how the game goes."

The other key opt-outs for Louisville are 1,000-yard receiver Ja'Corey Brooks, defensive lineman Ashton

Gillotte and Quincy Riley, who led the secondary with nine pass breakups and had two interceptions. They are joining Shough in preparing for the NFL draft.

The portal didn't have the same impact on the Washington roster, but the Huskies did lose promising freshman linebacker Khmori House, who transferred to North Carolina.

Freshman Demond Williams Jr. is expected to start at QB for the Huskies after taking over for Will Rogers in a 49-21 loss to top-ranked Oregon in the regular-season finale.
