

SERGEANT OVAL GRAY AMYX

MEMORY OF SERGEANT OVAL GRAY AMYX AND DESIGNATING A POR-TION OF KY STATE ROUTE 1593 AS SERGEANT OVAL GRAY AMYX ME-MORIAL ROAD.

WHEREAS, the Magoffin County Fiscal Court wishes to pay tribute to one of its native sons, Sergeant. Oval Amyx, who served his country with courage and valor during World War II; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Oval Amyx was a son of Magoffin County, born on October 5, 1914, on Johnson Fork; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Oval Amyx joined. the United States Army on January 30, 1940, and served with courage and distinction for more than four years. He was assigned to the 507th Infantry unit and participated in "Operation Overlord", the historic invasion of Normandy on June 6, 1944, that marked the turning point of World War II. He faced the enemy fire and the stormy sea and gave his life for the cause of freedom. He was reported missing for almost a month and then confirmed killed in action on July 2, 1944. His comrades told his family that he fell on the day of the invasion. His remains were returned home after the war;

WHEREAS, for his valor and sacrifice, Sergeant Oval Gray Amyx was awarded the Purple Heart and many other honors;

WHEREAS, Sergeant Amyx did not live to see the victory he helped secure or to share his stories with his loved ones and friends. He now lies in peaceful sleep. in the hands of the Supreme Commander at the Amyx-Allen Cemetery on Grape Creek in Magoffin County, Kentucky.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the section of KY State Route 1593, from mile point 2.107 to mile point 2.569, be designated as Sergeant Oval Gray Amyx Memorial Road, in recognition of his heroic service and sacrifice.

A RESOLUTION HONORING THE MEMORY OF PORTION OF KY STATE ROUTE 1593 AS PRIVATE OLIVER LYKINS MEMORIAL ROAD.

WHEREAS, the Magoffin County Fiscal Court wishes to pay tribute to one of its native sons, Private Oliver Lykins, who served his country with courage and valor during World War IT; and

WHEREAS, Private Oliver Lykins enlisted in the United States Anny on September 8, 1942, and underwent training as an anti-aircraft gunner at Fort Eustis, Virginia, and as an infantryman at Fort Edwards, Massachusetts, and Fort Gordon, Georgia; and

WHEREAS, Private Oliver Lykins was assigned to Co. F. 376th Regiment of the Third Army and departed for Europe in January 1945, where he faced fierce combat in Germany; and

WHEREAS, Private Oliver Lykins participated in the battle of the Hurtgen Forest, also known as the "Forest of Death", where he fought bravely against the enemy in difficult terrain and harsh weather conditions;

WHEREAS, Private Oliver Lykins made the ultimate

sacrifice for his nation and his comrades when he was killed in action on February 10, 1945, leaving behind his family and friends in Magoffin County; and

WHEREAS, Private Oliver Lykins was awarded the Purple Heart and other commendations for his heroic actions and his service to his country; and

WHEREAS, Private Oliver Lykins did not make it home to talk to loved ones and friends about his experiences of the war. The American Legion conducted the graveside service for Private Lykins. He now lies in peaceful sleep in the hands of the Supreme Commander at the Grape Creek Cemetery in Magoffin County, Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, the Magoffin County

Fiscal Court desires to express its gratitude and admiration for Private Oliver Lykins and to preserve his memory by naming a section of KY State Route 1593, on Grape Creek, from mile point 3;22 to mile point 3.65, as Private Oliver Lykins Memorial Road.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Magoffin County Fiscal Court that: Section 1. The Magoffin County Fiscal Court hereby honors the memory of Private Oliver Lykins and designates a portion of KY State Route 1593, on Grape Creek, from mile point 3.22 to mile point 3.65, as Private Oliver Lykins Memorial Road. Section 2. The Magoffin County Judge/Executive shall coordinate with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet and the appropriate officials to ensure that signs are erected reflecting this designation. Section 3. This resolution shall take effect upon its passage and approval. Adopted this 20th day of August, 2024. Matthew C. Wireman, Magoffin County Judge/Exec.
