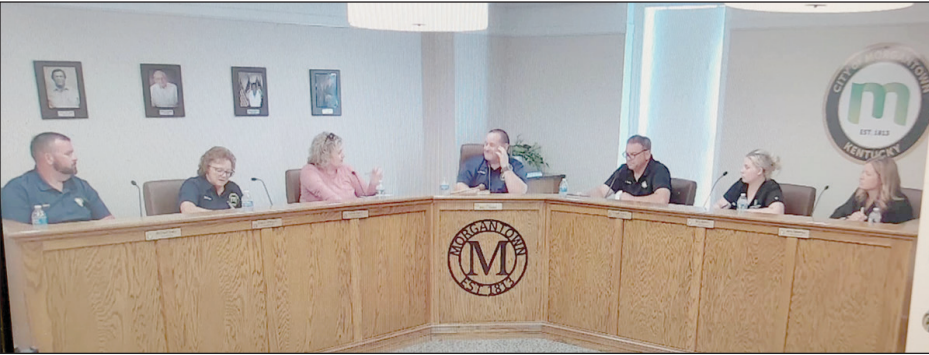


Morgantown City Council Struggles with TAP Grant

June 12, 2025
Morgantown City Council held its regular meeting.

Planning and Zoning was first. The public hearing of rezoning for the public library was approved. One permit was approved for a greenhouse.

Utilities reported two employees were in classes for certification. At the last meeting the second reading of the budget was held.

Tourism has a new chairman, Olivia Williams. A meeting will be held on the 26 at 5:30.

In May MOGO had 1620 riders and 672 meals delivered.

Code Enforcement reported 15 new cases opened and closed 18 cases. 4 citations were issued.

Fire Department reported: canceled

in route calls- county 1, medical assistance calls- county 3, city 4, structure fire calls- county 2, vehicle accident calls-county 4, city 1, calls for assistance- county 1, and smoke alarm calls- county 1, for a total of 17 calls.

Public Works reported changing some road tiles and hauling brush away.

Police Department reported 181 calls to service, 4 motor vehicle, 7 arrest, 2 criminal cases, 53 traffic stops, 17 citations, 47 courtesy notices, and several special details worked, bringing the total calls to service to 842.

The City Clerk reported they are finishing the audit. The Clerks off is working on closing out for the generator grant. They are also waiting on a partial payment for the farmers market grant.

In the Mayor's reports,

Mayor Phelps stated over 50 kids have come to work for the city during the summer. The MOGO bus assisted the Trail Town. The Summer Social went well. The Animal Shelter opened its Spay and Neuter Clinic building. ACS had a ribbon cutting with the Governor. The City sponsored Whiskers softball tournament will be June 28, 2025. Movies at the pool are going great with a good response. The TAP grant bid was \$322,000, only \$145,000 was awarded in the grant, the city agreed to add another \$50,000 to help things along. The reason the approval amount was so low is because the grant was applied for in 2017. Mayor Phelps is not sure that will be enough. The state is working to raise the amounts in the line items or the city can reapply.
