Bears fall in District Championship to Meade, 1-0

The 11th District Soccer Tournament was held at the **Grayson County** High School this past Thursday and Friday. Butler County took care of Grayson in a 5-0 shutout in the opening game before Meade County struggled a bit to finally put away the winless Wildcats of Edmonson County on the opening night. That set the stage for a Meade-Butler showdown in the championship on Friday.

The Bears, who had spanked the Cougars all year, had only contested the Green Wave once on the season, which they barely lost (3-2) at Meade County. Butler was missing some players in that matchup and felt really confident about their chance in the championship.

Meade played extraphysical on the defensive end from the beginning while not getting penalized for many fouls, which may or may not have allowed better scoring opportunity for the Bears. Regardless, the Bears fought through the adversity and stayed within striking distance on many occasions. Unfortunately, BC

could not manage to find the goal.

After an hour into the game, about the 12-minute mark in the second half, Meade got Bears goalie, Landon Beatty positioned on his right side of the goal as they attacked. At the last second they slipped a pass opposite side for a wide open score attempt, which they did not miss. It was the only goal of the night as the Bears defense was ferocious all night.

The Bears have much to be proud of and will continue their season within the 3rd Region Tournament starting this weekend. It is uncertain at print release on who the Bears will be facing. One thing is for certain, they will have a tougher opponent (likely Ohio County or Owensboro) with the runner-up finish versus coming out of the district as the
