OVER THE HILL

Cabin On The Hill by Kathleen Perry  
We built our cabin on the hill several years ago, from scratch. The lumber came from trees that had grown on my Mom's and Dad's hillside farm for many, many years. We had a man bring his sawmill in and saw it into the size boards we needed.  
We had some hand-me-

down-ceiling lights that a relative gave us. Another relative in Tennessee provided some beautiful cedar and pine of which our inside walls are made. We can still smell that cedar. It's like being inside a huge cedar chest. The few cabinets that we have in the kitchen end of the cabin are also made from this cedar.  
The set of glass doors

and the four other windows were also hand-me-downs, and they let in light from all four directions. Short red curtains run across the top of the windows and do not block the natural light coming in. The back door is wooden and was also given to us.  
The Better half built two sets of bunk beds; both had a double bed on the

bottom with a bunk bed on top. They work fine in the cabin. He also made a long kitchen-multi-purpose-table from a big maple tree that had grown for years around the hill from the cabin site. I can remember that tree from when I would go on the hill as a young kid to get the cow in the evenings.  
We have a wood burning cook stove in one cor-

ner that has put out some mighty good meals in the past twenty or thirty years! The tiny oven bakes a good pone of corn bread!  
The porch that goes all the way around the cabin provides a lot of extra space. The kids love it, and so do the "outdoors" people in our family. The porch swing out front is a favorite spot of mine.  
One thing (one?) we agreed on while planning the cabin was that we wanted electricity if possible. It was possible and we got it. For years the first thing we would do when we opened the back door and went inside was to plug in the Mr.

Coffee. That first cup of coffee was worth whatever it cost us to have power in our cabin on the other side of the hill!!  
We have enjoyed the wildlife, the weather and the beautiful sunsets here with family and friends. We pray this can continue for many years to come! There's something about this simple cabin in the woods that brings peace and happiness and I thank the Lord for it.  
A cabin like ours didn't cost us an arm and a leg and we are perfectly happy with it.  
Do you have a "happy place"?
