## YOUNG LADY OWLS TEAM PREPARE FOR A NEW SEASON



Coach Travis Smith has been practicing and preparing his 2025-26 Owsley County Lady Owls team for the upcoming season since October. Through evenings of conditioning and practice, and recently two scrimmages, it's time for actual games. The season opens December 5 at Middlesboro and December 6 in the PRTC Classic at Jackson County.

Coach Smith will have one of his youngest teams in many years. His roster has no seniors, one junior, three sophomores, one freshman, one eighth grader, and seven seventh graders.

"We are going to be very young and inexperienced this year, no doubt about that. But our goal is to steadily improve as the season moves forward and by tournament time have a competitive team," stated Smith.

One player returning with starting experience is junior Kamilla Marcum. The 6-foot center/ forward had surgery in the spring to repair a knee that had been causing her pain for the last couple of years. The surgery was successful, and she spent the summer rehabbing and recovering. She was given the go-ahead to resume practice about a month ago and is now back in action. That's good news to Coach Smith because he will be counting on her heavily this year to provide scoring and rebounding strength. She averaged over 20 points in the two scrimmages and appears to be well on her way back to

full mobility.

Kamilla gives the Lady Owls a scoring presence inside the paint, but she is also a deep threat from 3-point range. Last year, she averaged a double-double for Owsley, and that was playing on a painful knee. Now that she is healthy, Coach Smith says he anticipates her numbers to grow.

Also returning as a starter from last year is sophomore Delaney Smith, the coach's daughter. She is the primary ball handler and a very good 3-point shooter, which she exhibited during summer play. Delaney is also a crafty passer and good onball defender.

The spark plug of the team is sophomore forward Kiley Taylor. She is a high-energy player who plays with toughness and is one of the team's best defenders and rebounders.

Sophomore guard Harley Dooley is a twoyear starter. She has game experience, important on this very youthful squad. Harley is one of the better shooters on the team, especially from behind the arc. She had a good summer of basketball and has gotten stronger. She won't be available for a few more weeks while she is in a boot for an ankle injury and may possibly return in late December or early January.

Freshman guard Lauren Gay saw action last season as a reserve and will move into a starting role this season. Lauren is a very good 3-point shooter, and her ball handling and passing skills have greatly improved.

The rest of the team is composed of middle school players, all seventh graders except one. Of the middle schoolers, the one that will see quite a bit of play, possibly as a starter, is 6-foot seventh-grade post player Nala Pittman. Although a very young player, Nala brings length and size to the team and is a good rebounder and shot blocker. She also has a good touch around the rim. She had a great middle school season and is ready to bring her game to the varsity level.

Other seventh graders who will see plenty of varsity playing time are lefty guards Madi Cornett and Kierah Shouse. These two had a very good middle school season and are looking forward to helping the varsity. They will see quite a lot of playing time as reserves. They can both score the ball in a variety of ways, such as quick drives to the basket. And they play with a maturity much older than their actual ages.

The rest of the middle schoolers rounding out the roster are eighth grader Ginger Marshall and seventh graders Sophia Havicus, Alaina McIntosh, Serinity Callahan, and Emaleigh Herald.
