This Friday, April 11, St. James is hosting the FINAL Fish Fry of this 2025 Lenten Season. We invite everyone to join us for this finale before we enter the solemnities of the holiest week of our entire year beginning April 13.

On this Palm Sunday we celebrate Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem with the blessing of the Palms and procession into church from our initial gathering in the Parish Hall. 
