

# 39<sup>th</sup> District Baseball and Softball Tournaments Schedules Set

**Troy Archibald re-signs as Bracken County girls basketball coach**

Archibald was hired as the girls basketball coach for the 2021-2022 season, replacing Taylor Alstatt, who coached two seasons from 2019-20 to 2020-21 with a record of 8-47. Archibald coached the Lady Bears for four seasons with a record of 61-47. His teams won three straight district championships in 2023, 2024, and 2025. This past season's team won 23 games, tying for the school record for most wins since the 1991-92 season. They also made it to the regional semifinals for the first time since 2012.

(May 5) Bracken County got up big early, scoring seven runs in the first inning in Brooksville. Addy Tucker, Ella Burton, Kyndall Johnson, and Whitney Lippert all had homeruns. They collected 13 hits and walked nine times.

**Harrison County 10, Lady Bears 0**

(May 6) The Lady Bears lost in five innings to the Fillies in Cynthi-

**Lady Bears 7, Bourbon County 4**

(May 7) Four runs scored by Bracken County in the top of the 7<sup>th</sup> inning helped the Lady Bears beat Bourbon County in Paris. Ella Burton had a home run to start things off in the 7<sup>th</sup>, followed by a walk and four hits. Rees Hargett pitched a complete game, giving up one earned run, one walk, with seven strikeouts.

**Lady Bears 4, Perry County Central 1**

(May 9) Rees Hargett threw another complete game, giving up one run, seven hits, and one walk. Jordan Ahrens and Kyndall Johnson both hit doubles. This was the first of three games played in Clark County in the Jerry Puckett Showcase.

**Lady Bears 4, George Rogers Clark 0**

(May 10) On Saturday in Winchester, Addy Tucker threw a complete game, giving up four hits with three walks and one strikeout. Johnson, Burton, and Lippert had two hits each, all hitting a double. The game was played in six innings due to the 90-minute time limit.

**Lady Bears 9, Bishop Brossart 2**

(May 10) The Lady Bears capped off a five-win week by defeating

All "A" rival Bishop Brossart. Hargett threw another complete game, where she struck out 11 batters. The Lady Bears collected eight hits and six walks. Bracken County heads into the final week of the regular season with a 20-10 record.

## Resurfacing Project on Robertson County Roads

The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet advises motorists of a resurfacing project in Robertson County that began Tuesday, May 6. Crews will be resurfacing sections of two state routes: Blue Lick Road (KY 1029) from KY 165 to the 1.0 mile point; and Piqua Kentontown Road (KY 617) from U.S. 62 to Hoover Lane (CR 1101), a distance of 1.5 miles.

Crews will perform this work between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. Motorists should expect single lane closures throughout the

project area. Flaggers will be used on both sides of the work zone to guide traffic safely through. Plan ahead, and anticipate delays during peak travel times. The project is expected to be completed by June 30, 2025.
