CONSERVATION DISTRICT ACTIVITIES

The Conservation District promotes and assists in the conservation of our natural resources by the following activities:

POSTER & ESSAY CONTESTS

The annual conservation poster and essay contests, sponsored by the Conservation District, and Kentucky Farm Bureau, were very popular with local students. The theme for this year's contests was "Protect the Forest Together" Winners included: Art: 1st-Jada Ratliff, 2nd-Jolene Feagan, 3rd-Wylie Jones. Essay: 1st-Kinsley Moore, 2nd-Piper Scroggins.

COMMUNITY

After obtaining a grant from the Division of Waste management, in collaboration with Bracken Co. Solid Waste and Fiscal Court, BCCD held the 6th annual Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) collection event in August 2025. Began trash voucher program, offering free disposal of items not eligible for HHW or recycling.



SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

The Conservation District works closely with the county's school districts to offer numerous school involvement activities.

Each year the Conservation District promotes Earth Day! Tree seedlings are distributed to all 4th grade students each spring. Earth Day T-shirts have been presented to all 3rd grade students to emphasize the importance of conservation of our natural resources. The program was also expanded to offer seedlings to the public. Soil Stewardship theme: "Home is Where the Habitat is". The

theme encompassed types of habitat and the variety of species that depend on specifics in that habitat environment.

Before summer break the district teamed up with the FRYSC and Extension to host a Safety Day for 2nd-5th graders to promote



safety at home over the summer covering a variety of areas: water, electric, fire, first aid, cyber, vehicle, food, power equipment and farm.

Students were treated to Green Eggs and Agriculture during National Ag Month. When Taylor Students participated in Seuss-A-Palooza they en-

joyed a trail mix of items related to Dr. Seuss books and learned agricultural facts about those items. Over the summer they took field trips to local sites to learn more and get hands on experience with things that impacted and benefit from good soil and water health



The district continued the popular Backyard Conservation Program. The purpose of this program is to help Bracken County homeowners and residents promote the wise use of our soil and water resources by establishing, enhancing, restoring and/or maintaining a backyard conservation proiect. Projects ranged from compost bins, rain barrels, and raised garden beds, to bee hives and pollinator gardens.

Each year, the district awards scholarships to graduating high schoolers or even college students in the county. With a preference for those who are majoring in agriculture related field, the district also accepts and awards scholarships to those with other career goals. This year's scholarship recipients are: *Caleb* Emery, Jessica Mains, Owen Holleran, Savannah Kelsch and Jackson Gaunce..




WATER QUALITY & WATERSHEDS

The Conservation District has watershed maps available. Any landowner with 10 or more acres needs to have an Agricultural Water Quality Plan (AWQP) on file and reviewed/updated every three years or when changes on care of the land are made. EROSION CONTROL

The Conservation District encourages farmers to use conservation practices to control erosion on cropland, hayland and pastureland. Such practices include minimum or no-till plantings, contouring, stripcropping and adequate livestock watering systems. This is done through the Natural Resources Conservation Service Offices by the news media, articles, field days and through farm planning.
