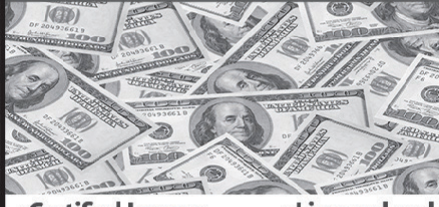

overseas all Army National Guard and Air National Guard units in the Commonwealth. Additionally, he is in charge of the Department of Military Affairs, Kentucky Emergency Management, the Appalachian and Bluegrass Challenge Academies and Bluegrass Station in Avon, Kentucky. Above the state level command structure is National Guard Bureau. From there, the command structure goes to the Departments of the Army or Air Force and so on.

He added, "By comparison, the reserve units are just simply a part of their respective branches of the military, Army Reserve, Coast Guard Reserve or Marine Corps Reserve for example."

With those who serve either in the National Guard or Reserve being citizens of communities like Scottsville, the bonds between communities and the military grow stronger. Gadbois mentioned to Scottsville Rotary that support for the military dropped drastically

during Vietnam. He also mentioned that former Army Chief of Staff Gen. Creighton Abrams (the namesake for the Abrams tank) realized that "very few National Guard and Reserve units as a whole were sent to Vietnam. Many of the reservists sent to Vietnam were sent as individuals to plug holes in active-duty units as they occurred."

Gen. Abrams' solution was, due to changes in the Military Selective Service Act, to restructure the Army "so that it couldn't go to war without including units of the National Guard and Reserve, thus helping to foster community buy-in for reservists (and the military as a whole), especially those deployed outside the US. These changes in the Army's force structure came into play during and as a part of the mobilization due to Operation Desert Shield and the subsequent Operation Desert Storm. In the post 9/11 military establishment, this is even more so evident with Guard and Reserve units deploying for up to a year at a time even

now."

Being able to recognize employers who not only hire National Guard and Reserve military personnel but go above and beyond in supporting them during their military duties is a big part of the reason for the ESGR's existence. It also encourages all employers to look at the bigger picture in what it means for the soldier and employer.

"I feel like my role as an ESGR area chair for Kentucky allows me to help build on that community buy-in that I spoke earlier about. From my two recent visits to Scottsville, the presenting of the Patriot Award at the city commission meeting and speaking at the Scottsville Rotary Club, I can tell that the citizenry and leadership of Scottsville, Kentucky definitely support this country's reserve component service members, National Guard and Reserve forces. I look forward to returning to Scottsville to answer questions or tell people about the ESGR's mission," concluded Gadbois.
