Discovery, plea and discovery conference is July 1.

•Curtis D. Senters was charged with first-degree possession of a controlled substance (drug unspecified), possession of drug paraphernalia, and third-degree criminal trespassing. Evidentiary review hearing is June 24.

•Ricky Chad Simmons was charged with flagrant non support. Status hearing is July 1.

•William Reid Sloan was charged with tampering with physical evidence, first-degree possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), and first-degree persistent felony offender. Evidentiary

review hearing is June 24.

•Melissa Dawn Thomass was charged with first-degree trafficking in a controlled substance (methamphetamine), and possession of marijuana. Discovery, plea and discovery conference is July 15.

•David Berry was charged with two counts of first-degree trafficking in a controlled substance (methamphetamine), possession of marijuana, and second-degree persistent felony offender. Ten year sentence imposed.

•Jennifer Diane Johnson was charged with three counts of first-degree possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), flagrant non support, second-degree persistent felony offender, possession of marijuana, and possession of drug paraphernalia. Evidentiary review hearing is June 24.

•Bradley Ray McPeak was charged with second-degree arson,

theft by unlawful taking of an automobile \$10,000 or more, second-degree persistent felony offender, and shock probation in felony convictions. Restitution review is July 29.

•Adam Brent Perry was charged with two counts of flagrant non support. Eight year sentence imposed.

•Colin James Slaymaker was charged with four counts of first-degree possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), three counts of possession of drug paraphernalia, first-degree criminal possession of a forged instrument, second-degree possession of a controlled substance (drug unspecified), theft by unlawful taking all others \$500 or more but under \$1,000, third-degree criminal mischief, operating on suspended or revoked operators license, third-degree burglary, theft by unlawful taking from a building, and second-degree persistent felony offender. Evidentiary review hearing is June 24.

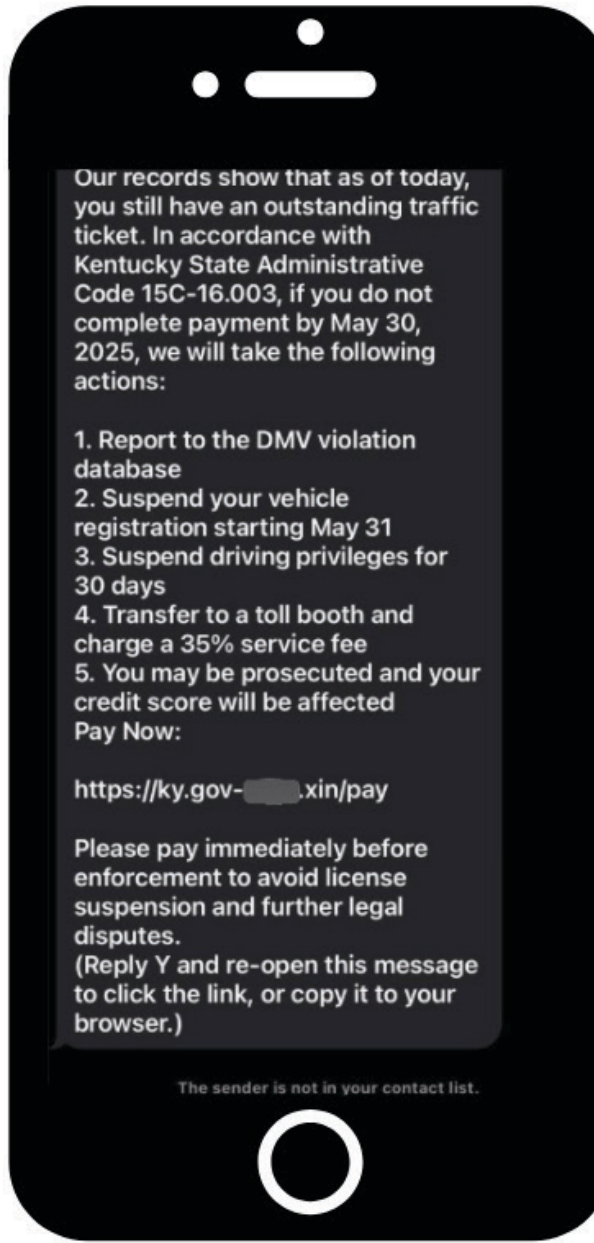
Text Message Scam Alert

FRANKFORT, Ky. (May 29, 2025) - The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) is warning Kentuckians of fraudulent text messages impersonating state agencies, which feature a suspicious link similar to Kentucky government website addresses.

The scam messages warn customers of unpaid traffic tickets and say that a “DMV violation” will be reported and “driving privileges” will be suspended if payment is not sent immediately.

If you receive one of these texts, do not click the link. Even if the web address looks like it belongs to a government agency, the text is a scam. KYTC does not collect traffic ticket fees or notify customers of violations, and we are taking appropriate steps to have the fraudulent websites taken down.

If you have provided any personal information, contact your bank immediately. You can also report this to the FBI’s Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) at ic3.gov, or to the Federal Trade Commission at reportfraud.ftc.

Notice of Request for Approval of a Municipal Pretreatment Program Modification

In accordance with the provisions of the Clean Water Act of 1977 and the National Pretreatment Program, Scottsville WWTP has developed and submitted for approval by the Energy and Environment Cabinet, Division of Water, a modification to the pretreatment program for the OCRWD. KEEC, Division of Water, has made a preliminary determination that this pretreatment modification meets the requirements of 401 KAR 5:057, Section 6 and 40 CFR 403.

The modification will result in the revision of local discharge limitations for the Scottsville WWTP.

Persons requesting a public hearing must state reasons why such a hearing is warranted. In accordance with 401 KAR 5:057, Section 8(2)(a)2, the public notice comment period will end on July 5th, 2025. If no comments to this notice are received, the proposed pretreatment program will be approved as set forth herein without changes and without further public notice. In such event, this notice shall constitute the “notice of approval or disapproval” required by 40 CFR 403.11(e) and no additional notice shall be provided.
