failure to wear seat belts, license to be in possession, failure of owner to maintain required insurance, operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of substances, possession of marijuana, first-degree possession of a controlled substance (drug unspecified), possession of drug paraphernalia, and tampering with physical evidence. Pretrial conference is January 20.

•Shannon Marie Miller was charged with theft by unlawful taking all others \$1,000 or more but under \$10,000, first-degree possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), and possession of marijuana. Pretrial conference is January 6.

•Desiree Rochelle O'Neal was charged with three counts of first-degree wanton endangerment. Pretrial conference is September 15, jury trial is between October 21 and October 23.

•Randall Warren Osborne was charged with two counts of promoting human trafficking victim under 18 years of age. Pretrial conference is February

3.

•Zachary Tervail Lee Pace was charged with enhancement first-degree possession of a controlled substance (cocaine), enhancement trafficking in marijuana, trafficking in marijuana, and possession of drug paraphernalia. Pretrial conference is February 17.
