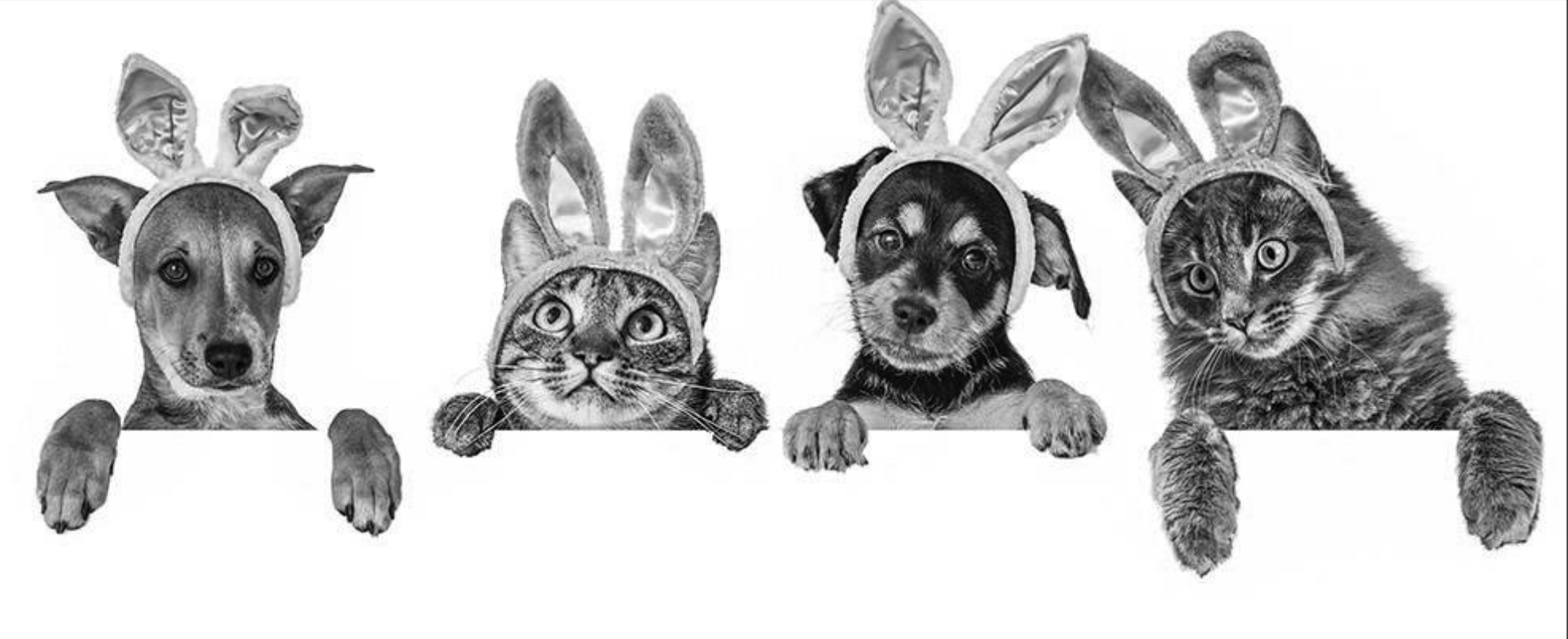


Hunt Easter eggs and meet fluffy friends

FISCAL COURT

On Tuesday, March 25, the Harrison County Fiscal Court met at 5:30 p.m.

After the standard opening business of call to order, prayer, pledge and roll call, the meeting got down to business.

Several matters were discussed in regard to new business.

The motion to approve the hire of Anthony M. Hollar as part-time Deputy Jailer/Community Service Assistant Coordinator effective March 15 at \$14 an hour carried.

As a matter of record, Brian Nickerson transferred from Community Service Coordinator to Part Time Deputy Jailer/Community Service Coordinator effective March 18.

As a matter of record, Bobby Barnes resigned from Justice Center Security effective March 19.

As a matter of record, Arbor Day Proclamation will be April 4.

It was noted that Spring Clean-Up Days will be April 24 and 25 from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30

p.m. and April 26 between 7:30 a.m. and 11:45 a.m.

Committee Reports were given next.

Shropshire Committee reported 13 adoptions, 7 rescues, animals in 44 and animals out 22.

Farm/Facilities Committee noted a short delay in the production/groundbreaking of the new rec center due to some issues with plans.

It was also noted that Columbia Gas has given a large estimate to bring gas across the road to the new center -- \$80,000 to run a ditch for the gas. They were told it wasn't budgeted for the ditch and conversations are still ongoing.

Parks and Recreation Committee reported that 560 kids were signed up for spring sports, a good up-tick from recent years.

In the Treasurer's Report, payment of bills were enclosed and transfers were approved.

The next Fiscal Court meeting will take place on Tuesday, April 1 for a workshop.

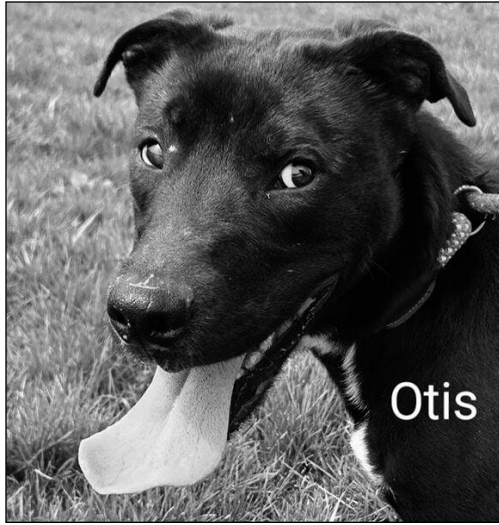
Kiwanis/D.Q. sponsor egg hunt April 12
