CITY OF BERRY BUDGET ORDINANCE 124-2025

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE CITY OF BERRY, KENTUCKY ANNUAL BUDGET, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2025, THROUGH JUNE 30, 2026, BY ESTIMATING REVENUES AND RESOURCES, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS, FOR THE OPERATION OF CITY GOVERNMENT.

WHEREAS, an annual budget proposal and message has been prepared and delivered to the City Commission, and WHEREAS, the City Commission has reviewed such budget proposal and made necessary modifications NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City of Berry;

Section 1. That the annual budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, Ending June 30, 2026, is hereby adopted as follows;
